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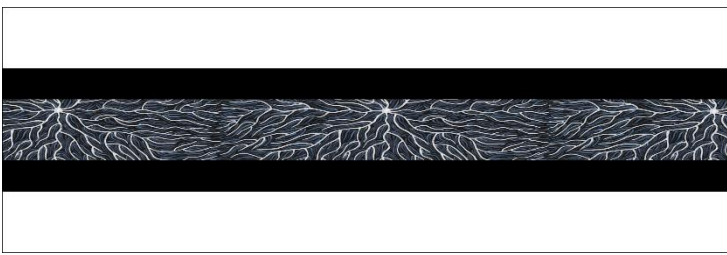
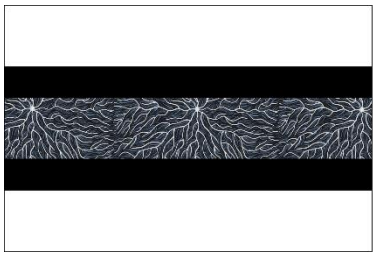

This project uses 5 fabrics: 1 print and 4 solid or solid-ish fabrics. The zigzag design looks good with a light and dark shade of the same color. The colors I used are for reference when looking at the picture, but you can use your favorite color palette! Just be sure to have contrast among your fabrics.

Focus (small print or solidish)	$\frac{3}{4}$ yard	<input type="checkbox"/> (4) 2" WOF strips <input type="checkbox"/> (2) 4" WOF strips <input type="checkbox"/> (1) 7" square	<input type="checkbox"/> $\frac{1}{4}$ " foot for piecing <input type="checkbox"/> Rotary cutter (treat yourself to a fresh blade!) <input type="checkbox"/> 6" X 24" ruler with 45° and 60° markings <input type="checkbox"/> Pins or clips <input type="checkbox"/> Neutral colored thread for piecing * Optional: Starch your fabric before cutting strips.

B (light blue)	$\frac{1}{3}$ yard	<input type="checkbox"/> (2) 1" WOF strips <input type="checkbox"/> (1) 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " WOF strips <input type="checkbox"/> (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips	
C (dark blue)	$\frac{1}{2}$ yard	<input type="checkbox"/> (2) 1" WOF strips <input type="checkbox"/> (2) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " WOF strips (sashing) <input type="checkbox"/> (4) 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " WOF strips (binding)	
D (black)	$\frac{1}{3}$ yard	<input type="checkbox"/> (4) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " WOF strips <input type="checkbox"/> (1) 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " WOF strips	
Backing	$\frac{1}{2}$ yard	<input type="checkbox"/> (1) 18" x 44"	
Batting		<input type="checkbox"/> (1) 18" x 44"	

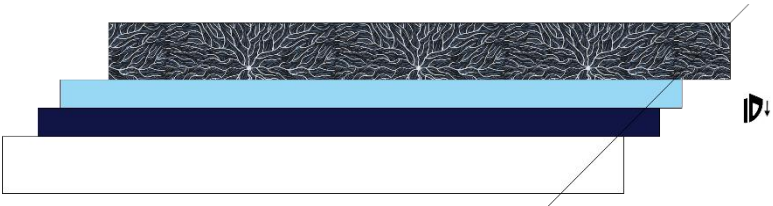
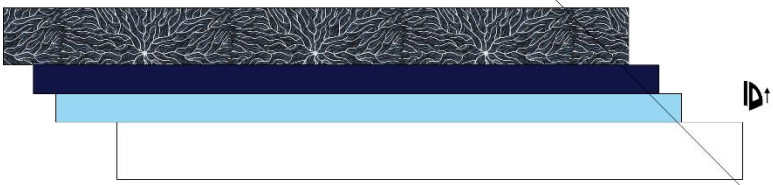
Before Class

Please sew the following six strip sets before class. This will ensure that you get to work on all 3 Seminole designs in class. All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press as shown.

You will have strips remaining after creating the strip sets.

Strip Set #	Fabric	Strip Width	
1	B D B	1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ "	
2	B A D	1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ "	
3	A D Focus D A	2" 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " 2" 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " 2"	
4	A D Focus D A	2" 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " 2" 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " 2"	 <p>This strip set is the same as #3, but it only uses half length strips (21" instead of 42" WOF). Cut 1 each of strips A, D and Focus in half to make this strip set.</p>

Strip sets #5 and #6 are sewn with a slight stagger at the ends to avoid wasting fabric. To figure out where to sew the strips together, line them up on the 45° line on your cutting mat. Don't worry if it's not perfect.

Strip Set #	Fabric	Strip Width	
5	Focus B C A	2" 1" 1" 2"	
6	Focus C B A	2" 1" 1" 2"
