




WSQ Presents Jean Impey

Jean Impey of SewJean.com is a passionate quilter, teacher and speaker with a mission to spark creativity and share the joy of quilting. She will be sharing her years of teaching and lecturing experience, along with her

love for textiles through engaging workshops and inspiring lectures. Jean's work has been featured in **Quilting Arts Magazine**, on **Quilting Arts TV**, and at premier quilting events such as the Houston International Quilt Show and Empty Spools Seminars. Her art is showcased in both public and private collections, including prestigious commissions for UCI Medical, Kaiser Permanente, CHOC and the Naval Hospital at Camp Pendleton.

At the April 24th, 1pm, WSQ General Membership meeting Jean will be entertaining us with her "Cre-a-tiv-i-ty" lecture – A fresh look at rediscovering inspiration and artistic courage.





The Friday, April 25, 2025, workshop will be "The Magic of Fabulous Faces". This one of a kind workshop is the result of two inspiring and energetic artists, combining their love of quilting, friendship and talents. In 2017 the renowned quilters Freddy Moran and Jean Impey joined their creative spirits teaching a Collage Retreat. Each artist has her own unique style of portraits and each portrait has a unique story and name. They taught retreats together and separately (Jean quilted and finished Freddy's pieces for her). Jean has developed two different unique styles of quilting these collages.

In this workshop Jean will help us dive into the art of crafting expressive faces with ease and minimal materials. Then we'll discover her unique quilting techniques to bring our designs to life, from quilting to binding.

The **Saturday**, **April 26**, **2025**, workshop will be "**Spider Webs**" – this quilt has been around for hundreds of years and there are many different ways to make one. Jean has come up

with a quick and accurate method using your fabric scraps to create a unique quilt. The spider web block can be made traditional, modern or liberated. In the workshop we'll learn new techniques that will improve our speed and accuracy which can apply to all







our quilt projects.

Charity Central

We received 61 finished quilts at the January meeting and gave away 80 to various organizations in the Spokane Community this quarter. Thank you for your help with this! We gave out all our Panel Kits and some of them are already completed as tops. They are so pretty! We will have more panel kits at our April meeting. I hope you will try one; they are very fast and easy to make!

We received another donation from Shabby Fabrics right before Christmas and have spent the last couple of months sorting and cutting it. I have gone through the entire thing and assigned all the fabric to be cut into various sizes for future kits. I hope you like scrappy kits because there are a bunch of them coming! So much beautiful fabric!

Who knew that so many people like to cut fabric? I sorted through all the Shabby Fabric and assigned it all to be cut into various sizes. Every time I got what I call an "amazing" amount of fabric ready to be cut, it all got picked up by someone who couldn't wait to get started! So, I thought that maybe some of you would be interested in cutting and donating your own fabric to us. We can no longer accept fabric donations because we get such a huge amount from Shabby, but we can accept cut up fabric to put into our scrappy kits.

The basis of most of our kits is the 6.5" square. Most of what we cut will all play nicely together and make a six-inch square. When cutting up fabric for scraps, always start with the biggest piece you can get out of it. There will be lots of scraps after that that can be cut into smaller pieces. If you would like to cut and donate fabric to us, we use the following sizes:

Squares: 6.5", 5" (charm square), 3.5", and 2.5"

Rectangles: 4.5" x 8.5" (Jewel Box), 3.5" x 6.5" (brick), 2.5" x 6.5", (Rail Fence) and 2.5" x 4.5" (potato chip)

Strips: 6.5" x WOF, 5" x WOF, 3.5" x WOF, and 2.5" x WOF

Triangles: 6.5" Half Square Triangle, 6.5" Quarter Square Triangle, and 3.5" Half Square Triangle.

We also accept orphan blocks, UFOs, and kits. We are happy to help you clean out your stash! Happy Cutting!

43rd ANNUAL QUILT SHOW APRIL 12-13 IN MOSCOW

Moscow, ID -- The public is invited to the 43rd annual Palouse Patchers' Quilt Show April 12 and 13 at the Latah County Fairgrounds Event Center, 1021 Harold Street, in Moscow. Show hours on Saturday are 10 am. to 5 pm. and Sunday, April 13, 10 am. to 4 pm.

The international theme "Around the World" highlights this year's queen-size raffle quilt which is done in pastels; the block style is "trip around the world." Tickets for \$1 each are available at the show. A winner will be drawn on Sunday afternoon; you need not be present to win. Cookies with an international theme will be available in the kitchen with free refreshments.

Over 200 quilts made locally are expected to be shown. Attendees can purchase items from 8 vendor booths plus a scissor/knife sharpening service. While the quilts are not for sale, fabrics, kits, patterns, and related quilting and craft items will be for sale. And Palouse Patchers' members will be selling quilted and hand-made gifts.

The show has been an annual hit with families and community members since 1981 and is a showcase for beginners and experienced quilters from the Palouse region.



The fee to enter is \$5.00 for the day, or \$3.00 for seniors 65+ and children under 10. Cash and Venmo payments accepted. Groups can request a discount by contacting Madeline Martin at mjmartin@pullman.com

One quilter will be awarded a monetary prize if they win the Janet Freitag Challenge using this year's theme "Bermuda Triangles." Guild members will also compete for the Quilt Show's Chairs' Challenge called "My Dream Vacay." Everyone can vote for their favorite quilts for Peoples' Choice awards.

DOUBLE PINWHEEL BLOCK

12" finished block size

Pattern from www.quilterscache.com

Supplies:

Purple: 2 - 6 7/8" squares

Teal: 1 - 7 1/4" square

White: $1-7\frac{1}{4}$ " square



- 1: Cut your purple 6 7/8" squares in half, diagonally.
- Stack your teal and white squares and cut in half diagonally, then in half again the other way.
- 3: With right sides together: Sew teal and white together:

Press towards the teal. Repeat for all four sets.




- 4: Lay purple triangle on top of half triangles, sew with ¼" seam. Press towards the purple. Square the unit if needed. Repeat for all 4 units.
- 5: Sew squares together in this order:
