Please join us at our afternoon or evening meeting in January to enjoy Karen's wonderful stories and beautiful quilts.



2nd VICE PRESIDENT: -- Karen Mathison – The Quilt Show is just a few weeks away. Thank you to the volunteers and especially the committee chairs. Many committees need help. Naomi Hall has more fabric for the Challenge if you need more. LCD found new and improved lighting. Posters and book marks are available, please take some and share. 
INSTAGRAM: -- Lisa Cox - Go to 'wsgspokane' for the account. If doing Show and Tell, please see Lisa.

A huge thank you to each and every one of you who volunteered to make our 39th annual show a big success. We had over 350 volunteers to fill around 500 positions.

We had much better success with our online registration and appreciate all those who registered quilts in this way. Please continue registering your quilts in this manner. It is really a big help. We had approximately 574 quilts and quilt related items this year.

We had 3,847 paid admissions, this is on par with most previous years. Our raffle quilt generated \$5,165. Moving the boutique proved to be beneficial. They had total sales of \$9,594 and had wonderful comments on the new layout. The new home for Quilts of Valor was well received, it proved to be the perfect location for their presentation. The Safety and security measures that were implemented last year were a success again this year.

Many thanks to our featured quilter, Lynda Lynn. Her beautiful body of work was an inspiration to many. I cannot thank the ladies that stepped up to chair a committee enough. Without their hard work, dedication and attention to detail, our quilt show would not be possible. What a wonderful group to work with and I am looking forward to working with them again this year.

We have already begun work on the 2018 quilt show. This will be our 40th Annual show. The theme is "Ruby Jubilee" and our featured quilter will be Susan Smith. 

 Iron the four patch. Now cut the four patch as follows: cut 1" from the center seam on all four sides.



3. Now swap the large squares, moving the floral fabric to where the cream fabric was and the cream fabric to where the floral fabric was. Then take the center square that was formed when you cut the four patch and turn it so you end up with a cream, a floral, a cream and a floral.



4. You now have a nine patch. Sew each row together and then the rows to each other.

Fat Quarter Exchange February 10, 2018

In lieu of exchange blocks there will be a fat quarter exchange. The theme fabrics for the exchange are fabrics to commemorate Valentine's Day. Please bring two fat quarters for the exchange. One name will be drawn for all the FQ's unless there is an abundance of FQ's then two names will be drawn. We are open to any suggestions you may have regarding the exchange activities. On December 9, 2017, my budget committee which included Patty Yedinak, Sue Otis, Robin Waggoner, Winnie Therrsen and Paula Ferry, met to prepare the 2018 WSQ budget.

The process of preparing the 2018 budget consists of the committee carefully comparing the current year's budget with the actual income and expenditures for the year and then we review the 2018 budget requests of the various committees for both the General and Quilt Show budgets. Then the budget is prepared for the presentation to the board for approval.

The 2018 WSQ Budget was presented to the board on December 13, 2017 and after discussion and approved changes on certain expenditures, both budgets were unanimously passed.

The focus of this year's budget in both the committee meeting and board meeting, were the increasing costs of most budget items and how much impact the lack of certain volunteer chair positions being filled affects the budget. In every budget report I mention how critical it is that the Quilt Show makes enough of a profit to fund the General Budget deficit so that the reserves are never touched. The profit from the quilt show subsidizes the speakers, quilting bees, library and workshops if they don't fill. Additionally, any additional funds left after profits are applied to the shortage in the General Budget, are deposited into an account for major purchases.

This account has been an important addition to the success of our guild in general and our quilt show because with the ever fast-growing technology, we are constantly having to update our various devices and software to keep pace. Also, things start to deteriorate like storage bins and sheets & gloves which need to be replaced and this fund is how these items are replaced without having to touch reserves or any overages in the annual budget. For 2018, the board approved the purchase of bins for the Library, batting for Charity Central, credit card readers and receipt printers for all events where we accept credit cards, upgrades for our camera system for Demos at the quilt show, equipment necessary for Special Exhibitions for the Quilt Show and shelving for the Boutique. The predicted amount for these purchases is \$2,000 and will be easily covered by this savings account.

A few highlights and changes to the actual budget line items are: General Budget – The elimination of 2 line items for Nominations and Parliamentarian as they don't use their budgets and, Quilt Show Budget – addition of Judging Fee income which are the funds collected for quilts that will be judged in the show; the line item which was formally Hoffman Challenge was changed to Special Exhibitions since this year we expect to have a new exhibition and going forward may continue to try to do something different, and finally the addition of Vender & Volunteer refreshments was added so that funds are available for the Merchant Mall chair to purchase these items for our vendors and volunteers at the quilt show.

Please continue to support our guild by attending workshops and the quilt show, purchasing raffle tickets, and of course volunteering. We are currently on our second year of major board positions not being filled.

I would like to thank my committee for the help and insight they provide in the preparation of this budget.


