President's Message July 2018

My name is Kathleen Woods and I am the interim President for WSQ. Sue Otis, the current President, has decided to step down and join her family in Minnesota. We wish Sue the best of luck with her move and with her family. Family always comes first; WSQ will carry on. I was previously President of WSQ in 2012-2013. It is a pleasure and a privilege to be returning to serve again.

I returned from a six week visit to my family in upstate NY to plunge into board meetings and to get up to speed on what has been happening with the board in the six months that I managed to be off it. There was a lot of familiar stuff going on and the same discussion of how do we get more help. There were some new faces and some new points of view. The thing I love most about being on the Board is all the points of view that are presented. They always make me stop and consider things I had not thought of before. We are so much stronger together than we are separately. During the ongoing discussion on getting more help, the usual



points of view were expressed but then there were some new ones. We are always in need of a fresh perspective and those that were presented really got me thinking. So much so that I would like to propose a few changes to the way things have always been done.

It was stated that our problem is not so much a volunteer problem as it is a succession problem. We cannot get anyone to succeed to a chairmanship on a committee that they know nothing about. We cannot get anyone to take over an Executive Board position (the five elected spots) if they have not had Board experience already. We need to grow our committees in order to grow our volunteer base. If people know what is involved in the task at hand, they will be more likely to take over if needed. Therefore, I am asking the WSQ Board Committee Chairmen to become Committee Chairmen in fact as well as in name. I think that the Board has gotten complacent about the way things have always been done and it is so much easier to do the job yourself than to teach someone else what to do and trust that they will do it. It's like teaching your kids to do chores. You may have to go around and clean up after them but eventually they figure it out and become a prouder and happier part of the family. I have asked the Board to go through their job descriptions and figure out which jobs they can have someone else do. I have asked them to form actual committees of three or more people to complete the tasks required. I have asked them to groom their own replacements and to plan their own obsolescence. I have issued badges so that the Board members are easily identifiable and asked that they introduce themselves to the membership and ask for help with their jobs.

Now I have things to ask of you, the Membership. I ask that you forgive any slights, snubs, or other hurts that you may have received from any committee that you have tried to join or left. I ask that you forgive the lack of follow up when you were eager to help and no one seemed to want you. I ask that you forgive your fellow members when they weren't as welcoming as they might have been. I ask that you fill out a volunteer profile form and try us again. We are only human and fallible. There will probably be hurts again but we are trying to be better. We are trying to make this a stronger and more vibrant organization. I ask that you go up to the committee chairman wearing a badge and introduce yourself and ask how you can help. We are trying to come up with jobs that everyone that wants to can do, from those who can make phone calls, to those who are only here part of the time, to those that want to jump right in and start something new.

There are several Board positions that will be opening up by the year's end. I ask that if you are interested in helping with something, that you find out what it takes to chair it. Board members attend 5 Board meetings a year, as well as the 4 General Membership meetings, both day and evening meetings. I would like all the committees represented at these meetings, not necessarily the chairman but someone knowledgable about that committee. They will recruit members to help on their committees so that the work is spread out. Many hands make light work and new friends are fun. If you have any suggestions on any aspect of WSQ there is a suggestion box at the meeting for your use or send us an email. We remember things better when they are written down and not lost in the chaos and excitement of the meeting. I hope you will give us a try. I look forward to hearing from all of you.

BUSINESS MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: 1:05pm by President Sue Otis

<u>Announcements:</u> Sue Otis as President for 2018, welcomed new and returning members, guests, and Guest Speaker Meg Hawkey from Crabapple Hill Studio. The Executive Board members were introduced: 1st VP- Paula Ferry; 2nd VP- Karen Mathison; Treasurer- Robin Waggoner; Secretary- Sandy Haase; Parliamentarian- Edie Milanovich. The locations of committee tables were pointed out, as well as the Guest Raffle Quilt- 'Fire and Ice'- shown by the Deer Park Fat Quarter Quilters. Tickets are on sale for the 2018 WSQ Raffle Quilt: "Picnic Among the Flowers".

Sue announced that, although a difficult personal decision, she will be stepping down as President immediately. She will be moving to Minnesota to be closer to family. Bylaws state that either the 1st or 2nd Vice President may step into the position if a vacancy occurs midterm. As both Paula and Karen are involved in planning for 2019, they are unable to do so. Kathleen Woods has volunteered to act as President through the remainder of 2018. The Executive Board has voted to confirm her as Interim President. Sue expressed her appreciation for her time as president and encouraged all members to consider volunteering in some capacity. <u>Minutes</u>--A motion was made by *Judy Clark* to approve the January Quarterly Membership Minutes as published in the newsletter and seconded by *Wendy Seinkenecht*. 1st VICE PRESIDENT-- *Paula Ferry*—Paula thanked President *Sue Otis* for her time as President and for serving in the past as 1st Vice President and Speaker Coordinator. Sue was presented with a gift card in appreciation for her time and volunteer service. The Meg Hawkey workshops for Friday April 27 and Saturday April 28 are both filled.

Speaker for the July 26 General Meeting will be Kimberly Einmo. Workshop for July 27, Lone Starburst, is full. The Saturday July 28, class is Modern T's. There are openings available for this Saturday workshop.

Speaker for the September 28 General Meeting will be Becky Goldsmith with Piece O' Cake Designs. Friday workshop will be Tile Tango, featuring needle turn applique. Saturday's workshop will be Bullseye Quilts, with a paper piecing focus.

January 2019 speaker is Kathy McNeil. Friday will be a flower block using the Apliquick method of applique. Saturday's class will be 'Under the Sea', with 3 designs to choose from: Otter Friends, Sea Turtle, or Octopus. Applique may be done raw edge, Apliquick method, or needle turn. Thank you to Leslie Green, Publicity Chairman. Members are encouraged to pick up bookmarks to distribute to the community. Posters will be available next week. Sign-ups for volunteering at the quilt show will be available at the July General Meeting.

TREASURER--*Robin Waggoner*—Business checking balance: \$82,494,16. Capital checking balance: \$4,466.99. Total CD's: \$53,818.29. Total cash position: \$140,779.44. Signed Treasurer's report is filed. As always, all records are open and available. If there are any questions, please contact Robin.

This position will be open and will need to be filled this election cycle. It is possible that the job responsibilities can be shared. Kimberly will teach you how to strip-piece and cut diamond building blocks from strips using her EZ Jelly Roll Ruler with no "Y" or set-in seams. You'll design your own unique Lone Starburst variation quilt! The first part of the class focuses on accurate and efficient cutting and piecing of the diamond units and the latter part of the class will focus on design elements and the almost limitless possibilities for designing your own layout using your diamond units. The real magic comes from the fact that the quilt is assembled with straight-set blocks, not diamond wedges or blocks on point. This is an eye-opening class for anyone who wants to create a one-of-a-kind quilt with a Lonestar twist!



Saturday Class—Mystery Quilt!

6-hour class / Skilled beginner - intermediate level

Do you love to make mystery quilts? Or does the thought of choosing fabrics and making a quilt for which you have no idea what the end result will be scare you? Fear not! Whether you are a seasoned veteran and you enjoy the intrigue and suspense of not knowing the final outcome or if you have never had the courage to tackle making a mystery quilt before, Kimberly's ultra-popular mystery quilt classes and patterns are perfect for you! She has designed the entire process to be simple, fun, and stress-free so you can take as much risk as you like with your fabric selections or risk nothing at all. Step out of your "color comfort zone" and try something new. The rule of thumb is this: if your fabrics have good contrast, look great when lined up together, and match the values given in the fabric requirements table, then they'll look beautiful when sewn together. These classes are suitable for any quilter with some rotary cutting and machine piecing experience and guaranteed to be fabulous and fun!

JULY 2018 BLOCK EXCHANGE

Patriotic Ohio Star 12 1/2" unfinished

White or White on White:

Cut: 4 - 4 1/2" squares

1 - 5 1/2" square. Cut diagonally in both directions.

Blue:

Cut: 1 - 5 1/2" square. Cut diagonally in both directions.

1st Red:

Cut: 2 - 5 1/2" squares. Cut diagonally in both directions.

2nd Red:

Cut: 1 - 4 1/2" square

Assemble:



1. Make four sets of a white triangle and a red triangle. Make four sets of a 1^{st} red triangle and a blue triangle. Press



 Combine a unit from each of the above color combination to form an hour glass looking unit. Trim to 4 1/2".



 Lay out your rows as follows: 1st row: white square, hour glass unit and white square.

2nd row: hour glass unit, 2nd red square, hour glass unit.

3rd row: white square, hour glass unit, white square.

4. Sew rows together.
