About Laura

I have been a quilt artist for almost twenty years. My one quilting class was with Natasha Kempers-Kullen at Asilomar in 1999. Otherwise, I am self-taught. I had an art minor at UC Berkeley, and have taken numerous painting and drawing classes at the local community college. I have a MA and two teaching credentials in the field of Special Education- I spent 35 years employed by the Mendocino County Office of Education as an Orientation and Mobility Instructor for the Blind, and am now retired.

My quilts have been shown regularly since 2000, and awarded ribbons periodically at many quilt shows across the US, including the AQS shows in Paducah and Nashville and IQA shows in Houston and Chicago.

I was a guest on The Quilting Show with Alex Anderson and Ricky Timms in 2017.

I have been lecturing and teaching landscape collage classes for quilting stores, quilt guilds and private groups in northern California and the west coast for the past twelve years.

Ukiah, California has been my home for my entire adult life, which is where I raised my three children. Besides quilting, my major hobbies include bicycle riding, kayaking, hiking, organic gardening, and writing. I am the author of a book (a memoir on my experiences working with blind children and their families), which was published in 2007 by Medusa's Muse Publishing Company.

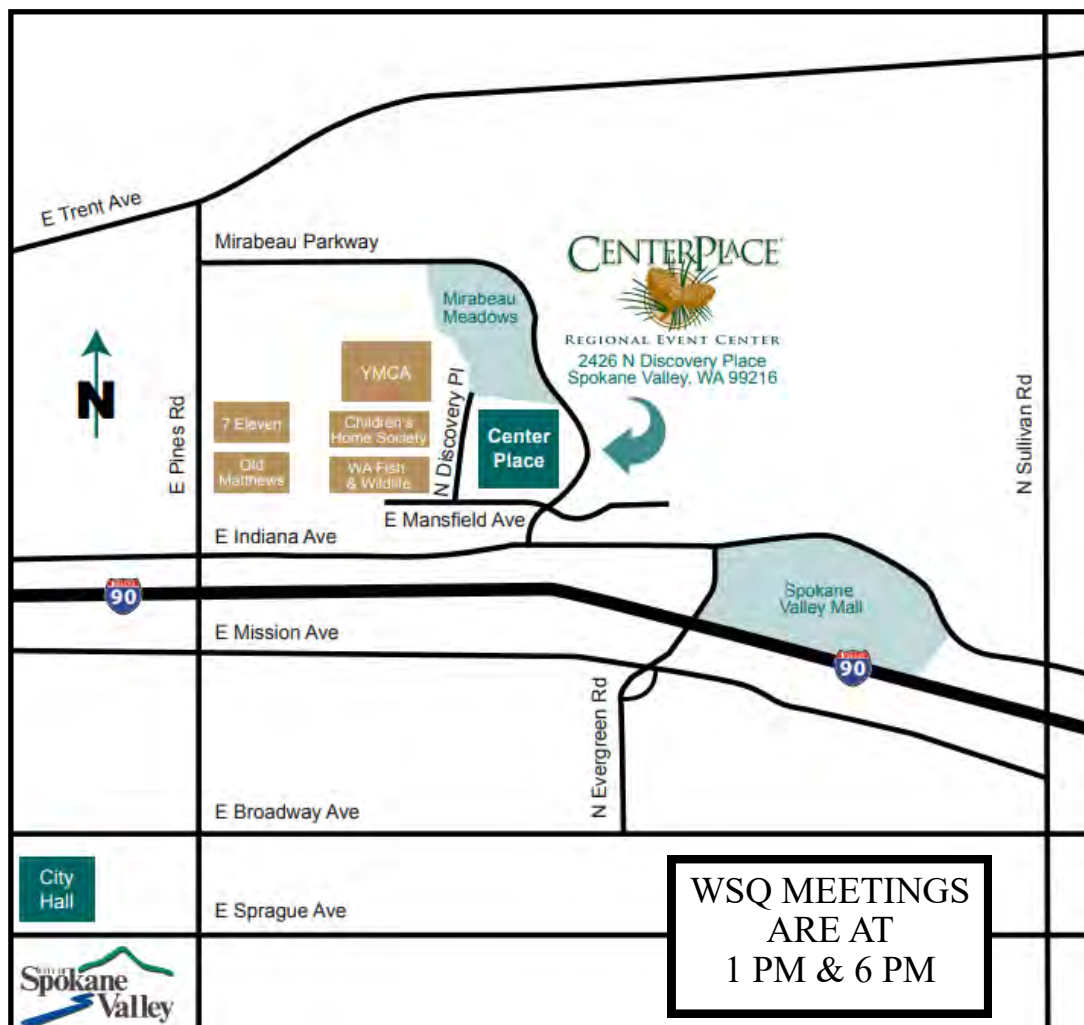

President's Letter

What a winter it has been! I hope that you were able to spend some of those snow days quilting! It feels so good to have the sun back again and moving into Spring. At the January meeting, I talked about the importance of wearing your name tag so that everyone knows your name. At the April meeting, we will have a small gift for those who remember to wear their name tag. Quantities are limited so forgive us if we run out! When you check in, the Hostesses will ask about your name tag and present you with our thank you gift. Thank you for letting us know who you are!

We are still in need of a few good people to serve on the Board. We need someone to do the Fair Ribbons for us. The local Fairs really enjoy having an extra ribbon to award thanks to WSQ. They are struggling and every little bit helps. Isn't there anyone out there who would like to take this on for us? You design the ribbons and send them out to the Fairs who have the judges award them based on our criteria. It's an easy job and everyone loves to win a ribbon!

We still need someone to chair the Fundraising committee. This can be as simple as selling the Quilt Show pins or as complex as you want to make it. We will need someone to take charge of selling the pins at the meetings and the Quilt Show. The pins are here and ready to go.

We also need someone to do Publicity for us. The attendance at the Quilt Show has fallen over the last several years and we suspect this is because we have not had a full time publicity chairman for a long time. Advertising is so important to the success of any event. They won't come if they don't know it is happening. The posters are made and the bookmarks are being distributed, but we need more than that. If you have had any experience in public relations or advertising, we could really use your help.

We also need someone to take over our as our Volunteer Coordinator. This position needs someone who likes to talk to people. Our members have been filling out the Volunteer Forms and now we need someone to follow up on them.

Thank you for your participation in our Volunteer Profile project. Thank you for wearing your name tags and getting to know each other a little better. Thank you for your participation in our many activities: Block Exchange, Bus Trips, Quilting Bees, Yard Sale, Library, Charity Central, Raffle Quilts, Spokane Fair, and especially the Quilt Show. You are doing a lot! The Board is doing a lot as well, trying to tighten up policies and procedures so that we can run as efficiently as possible with fewer volunteers.

Part of the reason that I volunteered to be President for the second time was because I think that WSQ is in trouble. We are getting older as an organization; we have very few young people who are members. Most of our new volunteers are the just retired and we love



them for finally getting a chance to help. Many of us have held positions in WSQ for many years and feel that now, it is someone else's turn. The problem is, there are fewer who are willing or able to do that. The Board and I will be taking a long hard look at where your interest and participation is with regard to this organization. We will continue to ask for help for the various tasks and activities but if help is not forthcoming, we will be looking at consolidating our efforts into the fewer things that people seem to be interested in.

If no one steps forward to take on the Fair Ribbons, we will not give out ribbons to the local Fairs and they will struggle on without our help. If no one steps forward to take up Fundraising for us, we may have to raise the dues to make up for the income that we are no longer receiving. If no one steps forward to help with Publicity, our Quilt Show attendance will continue to dwindle and as a result, our Quilt Show will also get smaller as we are not able to rent the entire space we currently use. If our income from Fundraising, Quilt Show, and Membership dues continues to decrease, our activities will also decrease.

There are many new faces on the Board and a new excitement and energy to make this the best organization it can be. But we cannot do it alone. We need your help. We are older too and have the same problems that you have; aging parents, ill spouses, hard turns that life has taken. If we all do a small thing, it will add up to a big thing and we will be able to continue doing all the wonderful activities we have done in the past.

My wish and my hope is that you will take a long, thoughtful look at WSQ and what you like most about it. Then consider what small thing you can do to help so that the activities you enjoy so much can continue. Without your help, we won't be able to continue as we are. We will have to change. It is as simple as that. Can I count on you?

2-Day Landscape Workshop with Laura Fogg

April 26-27, 2019

Expect this to be a fun, creative, beginner-friendly, out-of-the-box class. You do not need to have any quilting skills besides basic knowledge of how to do freehand machine quilting on your home sewing machine, nor do you need to be a recognized artist. You will discover the “artist within” as you play with the fabrics of your choice to create a small (about 2’ by 3’) collage wall quilt. Subject matter can be a landscape, a still life, or even a fantasy scene... whatever moves you to want to create it in fabric. You will start with a photo of your chosen scene for inspiration and beyond that your own imagination is the limit. (One caution though... for beginners it is smart to avoid subjects that include complicated architecture such as houses or bridges. You will get frustrated trying to get the perspective and details “right.” It will be more fun to stick to nature scenes, where nothing you do can possibly be “wrong.”)

Basic technique is raw-edge fabric collage, where cut or torn pieces of fabric (and/or other materials) are layered and freely arranged to create as much or as little detail in your piece as you see fit. Nothing is pinned or sewn until you are happy with your design, so the stakes are low and the composition can be changed infinitely. There are no patterns, no directions, and no rules.

We are introducing a Featured Category this year, Wool Quilted Project. The wool item must be 3 layers, be quilted, and have at least 50% wool in the top. Registration forms will be available at the April meeting. Please make sure that you have included all your information so if we have questions about your entry we can call you to clarify. With the quilt show database doing more work for us, we were able to streamline our forms this year. We will have a more detailed list of information on the website for all the category descriptions. We have our professional quilt judge booked for 2019. By checking the appropriate box on your entry form and paying a \$10 fee per quilt, you can get her feedback on your quilts when you drop off your quilt top at your designated drop off location.

We encourage you to get your items ready to sell again this year in the Boutique. Forms will be ready at the April and July meetings.

Naomi Hall and her committee have been working hard to get the challenge ready to reveal at the April meeting. Stop by the challenge table and pick up your packet.

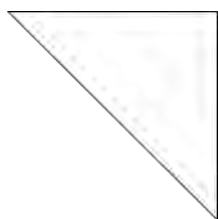
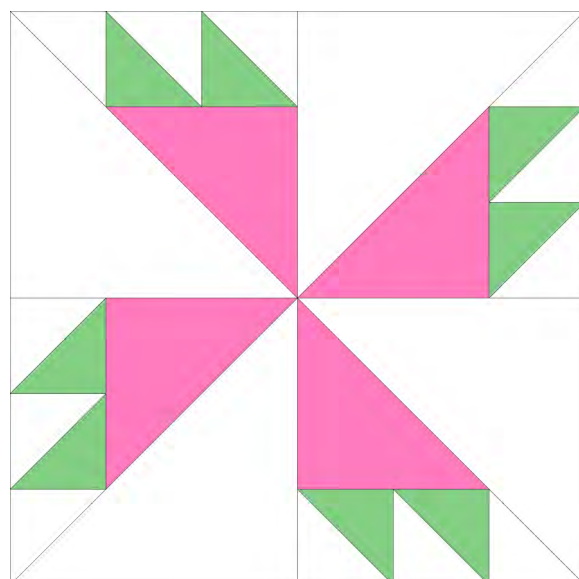

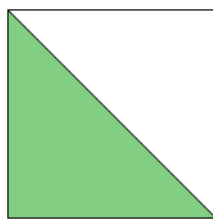

 CUT (6) 2 7/8" SQUARES

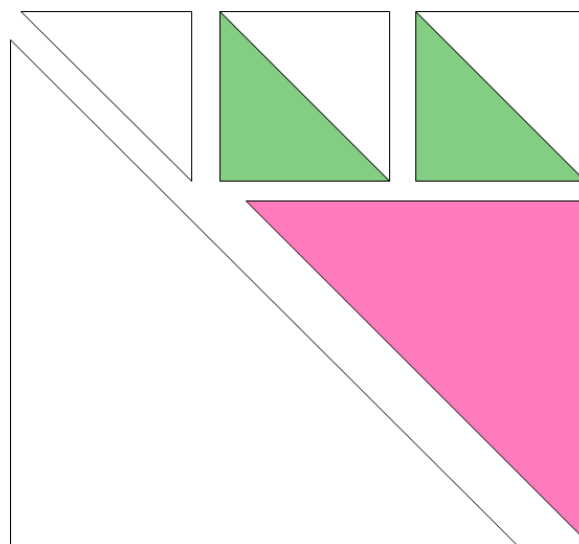

Quarterly Membership Meeting Minutes

MEETING DATE: January 24, 2019

MEETING LOCATION: CenterPlace – 2426 N. Discovery Place – Spokane Valley, WA 99216

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m. by President Kathleen Woods.

PRESIDENT'S ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- Kathleen Woods welcomed the members to the meeting and introduced the 2019 Executive Board. She also recognized and thanked the 2018 Board for their service.
- Kathleen pointed out the committees with displays in the meeting room including Block Exchange, Charity Central, Bus Trips, Library, Fundraising, Yard Sale and the Raffle Quilts.
- Kathleen asked all members to check out the Fundraising table with items that are on sale because we have no Chair for this committee and are selling out our inventory.

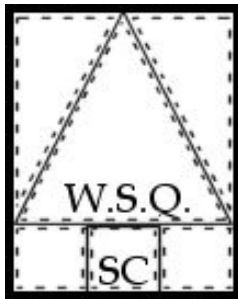
