The Artistry of Kathy McNeil

Our January speaker is Kathy McNeil, an internationally award winning quilt artist, author, pattern designer, teacher and judge. Hand appliqueing thousands of little scraps of fabric together, she creates quilts that look like paintings. These wall hangings are inherently and symbolically full of love and comfort. Often using over a hundred different fabrics in one composition, she revels in adding small details and surprises for the viewer to find. The quilting itself adds an additional element of texture to her work. Her quilts are



frequently featured in museums, magazines, calendars, and international shows. Many of her quilts are in private collections.





BUSINESS MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: 1:00 pm. By Interim President Kathleen Woods.

<u>ANNOUNCEMENTS</u>: Kathleen Woods introduced the board and the locations of committee tables. She also welcomed Members and any new Members. She pointed out the Quilt Show volunteer sign up tables. The 2018 WSQ Raffle quilt is on display as well as "Pineapple Blossom" by the Spokane Valley Quilters and INMQ selling raffle tickets for Machine Quilting.

<u>MINUTES</u>: A motion was made to approve the July Quarterly Membership Minutes as published in the newsletter and seconded. The motion was approved unanimously subject to final approval at the evening meeting.

Final count for entries this year is 650. There are 101 entries in the Ruby Category. Thank you for supporting that. Drop off is Saturday, October 6 through Saturday, October 13. All drop off volunteers, please pick up your packets and thank you for volunteering. The Quilts of Valor are with us again this year and please attend their moving presentation. Friday, January 25 New Beginnings

One day Hand Appliqué workshop for confident beginners and intermediate appliqué students. \$13.95 Required New Beginnings pattern fee. Pattern must be pre-ordered from Kathy's web site so students will have the instructions for preparing their background oval. www.kathymcneilquilts.com.



The language of flowers, is a means of communication through the use of flowers. Meanings have been attributed to individual flowers for thousands of years. My Tussie Mussie blocks each convey a special sentiment. Start with the "New Beginnings' Block for this project.

Kathy will be teaching the **APLIQUICK** method of turning your edges to create each flower and ribbon unit. Unit appliqué is a versatile appliqué technique very usual in creating complex blocks or appliquéd wall hangings. Tools for this technique will be available to try in class or you can pre-order them from her web site. Needle turning will work, but Kathy will not be teaching that method, so you must be comfortable with that technique. Learn basic hand embroidery stitches and how to make dimensional cherry blossoms to enhance the visual impact of your block. You will be delighted with the shading possibilities of fabric

paint crayons too! Although we will just be working on the floral units in class, Kathy will cover the assembly of this beautiful Victorian block. Watch a free video of the Apliquick method on my web site if you are curious about this technique before class.

Saturday, January 26 Under The Sea

6 hour workshop. Pattern Fee \$13.95...Pattern to be ordered from Kathy's website. Your choice of one of these two patterns to be used in class.

Fast, fun, and Oh so Beautiful. Step into the world of pictorial quilting. Add novelty fussy cut images to personalize your under the sea quilt. Choose one of these beloved animals. Learn the steps of layered appliqué. Choose the easy turned edges **Apliquick method**, or raw edge fused. Have fun with painting to create form and dimension in your animals. Kathy will demonstrate her fabric paint crayons to add lovely hints of shading. We will finish with a discussion of how to quilt the pictorial quilt.



ARROWHOOD BLOCK (9" Unfinished)


White on White:

Cut 1 - 8" square


Red (Think Valentine Fabric):

Cut 1 - 8" square

Assembly:



2. Use a short stitch length. Start stitching, using a backstitch, 2" from the top edge and continue stitching down that side, pivoting 1/2" from the corner and sew across that side. See example.




4. Cut the square diagonally through the corners that are sewn and then stack the resulting triangles, carefully aligning all edges.




6. From the bottom of the stacked triangles, cut 2"

7. Press all the sewn units and arrange the units as follows:



8. Final press and then trim the block to $9'' \times 9''$, being careful to center the block.

Notes to 2019 Budget

On December 8, 2018, my budget committee which included Kathleen Woods, Robin Waggoner, Nancy Ledeboer, Paula Ferry and Anita Pederson, met to prepare the 2019 WSQ budget.

The process of preparing the 2019 budget consists of the committee carefully comparing the current year's budget with the actual income and expenditures for the year and then we review the 2019 budget requests of the various committees for both the General and Quilt Show budgets. Then the budget is prepared for the presentation to the board for approval.

The 2019 WSQ Budget was presented to the board on December 12, 2018 and after discussion and approved changes on certain expenditures, both budgets were unanimously passed.

The focus of this year's budget in both the committee meeting and board meeting, were the increasing costs of most budget items, particularly the costs of putting on the guild's annual quilt show in addition to increasing costs for the venue for the Quilting Bees and Yard Sales. So far we are still able to maintain our current membership dues and cost of entry into the quilt show without increases.

In every budget report I mention how critical it is that the Quilt Show makes enough of a profit to fund the General Budget deficit so that the reserves are never touched. The profit from the quilt show subsidizes the speakers, quilting bees, library, charity central and workshops if they don't fill. Additionally, any additional funds left after profits are applied to the shortage in the General Budget, are deposited into an account for major purchases.

This account has been an important addition to the success of our guild in general and our quilt show because with the fast-growing technology, we are constantly having to update our various devices and software to keep pace. Also, things start to deteriorate like storage bins and sheets & gloves which need to be replaced and this fund is how these items are replaced without having to touch reserves. For the 2019 budget, the board approved the purchase of bins for the Library, batting for Charity Central, upgrades for our camera system for Demos at the quilt show, new books and archiving supplies for our new Historian to update WSQ's records and funds allocated for website updates. The estimated amount for these purchases is \$3,150 and will be covered by this savings account.

A few highlights and changes to the actual budget line items are: General Budget – The elimination of the line item; Quilt Promo – Volunteer Fair Passes as these will be combined along with a budget for parking passes for volunteers at our Fair Booth during the Spokane International Fair, into the Quilt Promo – Spokane Interstate Fair and elimination of the Judging Fee Expense as INMQ pays for this expense.

Please continue to support our guild by attending workshops and the quilt show, purchasing raffle tickets, and of course, volunteering. We have many board positions available and would love to welcome you to our board.

I would like to thank my committee for the help and insight they provide in the preparation of this budget.


