Meet Modern Quilter Heather Black

Heather Black first tried quilting in 1995 but didn't catch the quilting bug until 2011 when she designed, pieced and hand quilted her first queen size quilt. Shortly after that she discovered modern quilting and from that point on Heather has been designing and making quilts whenever possible. Her quilts and patterns have been featured in various quilting publications including Modern Patchwork, Curated Quilts, and Simply Modern. She is currently working on a book to be



released early 2020 and has quilts in two other books: Modern Quilts for a New Century and Modern Patchwork Home. Heather has had a myriad of quilts displayed at international, national and local quilt shows. Her quilts have hung at International Quilt Festival, Houston and Chicago, AQS Fall QuiltWeek, QuiltCon, MQX Midwest and many more. She won first place in use of negative space for her Urban Trek quilt at QuiltCon 2018 and several ribbons in local shows.

Along with quilting, Heather is a mom of a beautiful young girl, CoraJoan, and lives in Spokane, WA. She is currently the President of the local Modern Quilt Guild, Inland Northwest MQG.

Heather will be teaching "Modern Drunkard's Path" on Friday, and "Secrets of Modern Half-Rec Triangles, Triangles, and Diamonds" on Saturday. See pages 6-7 for details and registration form.

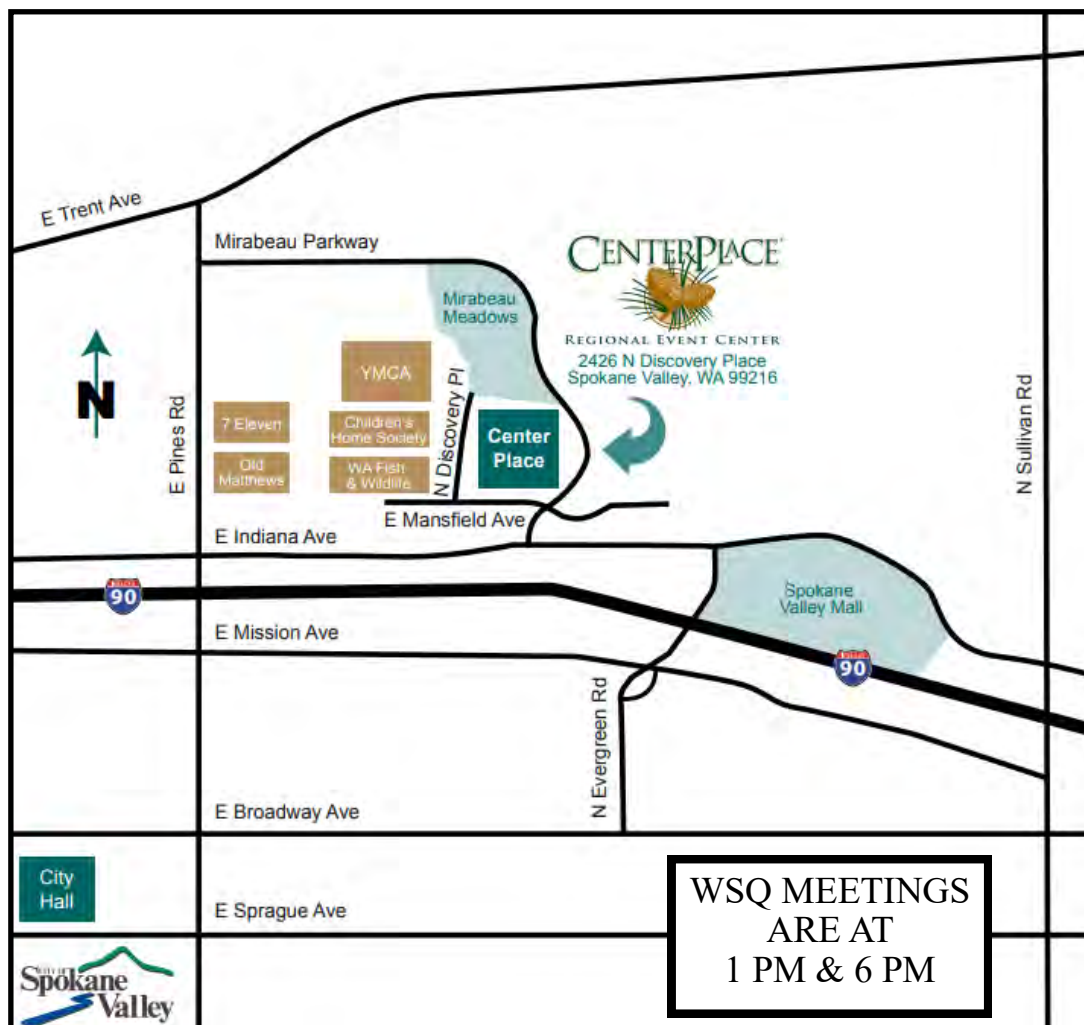

We will be watching and looking for ways to make WSQ a leaner and more vital organization, the way you want it to be.

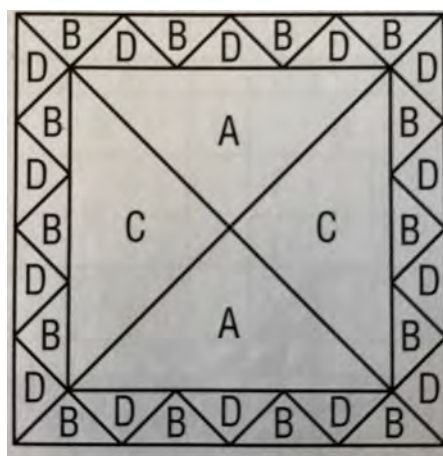
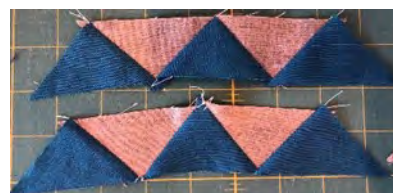

WSQ July Raffle Block

Please use solid gray and teal colors. We are going for a modern vibe. If you have any questions please feel free to call Karen at 509-993-3647.

- Cut (1) 8" square of gray and (1) 8" square of teal. Cut in half diagonally twice.
- Cut 7-3 1/2" squares of gray and teal. Cut in half diagonally twice.
- Using 2 of the gray and teal triangles from the 8" block, assemble the center
- Using the triangles from the 3 1/2" blocks, assemble the sides and corners as shown.
- Pay close attention to color placement.



Bring your finished block(s) to the July membership meeting to be entered in a drawing for the blocks!

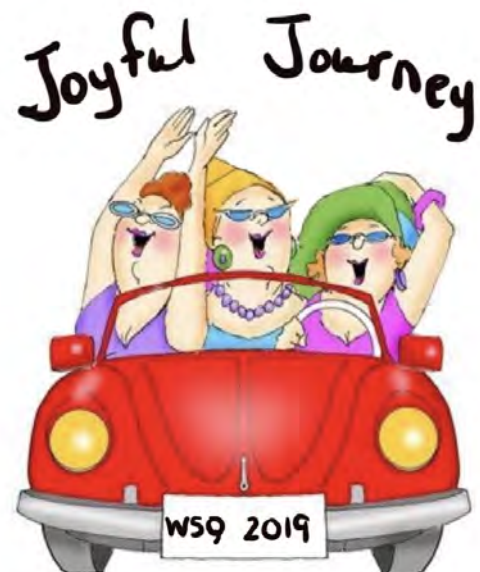

- Kathleen asked for volunteers for Fundraising, Volunteer Coordinator and Publicity Chairs. At the afternoon meeting Aubrey Harris volunteered to chair Fair Ribbons. She also asked for people who would be willing to make 10-20 phone calls to recruit volunteers from our list for committee work.
- Kathleen reported that the Board is discussing a new website and looking for people to help.
- Kathleen reminded members of the North Idaho Quilt Show on June 14-15 and one of our members, Barb Lambrecht, is the featured quilter. Bookmarks for the show were available at the meeting.
- Kathleen and Lisa Cox thanked the members for their support of Lisa's Teddy Bear Quilt program at the Indian Trail Library. Lisa also thanked Brenda Burger for her help. There were 4 boys and 6 girls in the program held on April 13.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: The minutes from the last meeting were published in the Newsletter. There were no corrections or additions. The minutes were approved pending the evening meeting.

VOLUNTEER OF THE QUARTER: Kathleen said this Quarter we are honoring Robin Waggoner for her contributions to WSQ as Treasurer and help in volunteer coordination. Robin received a certificate of thanks, a pin and a free workshop.

OFFICER REPORTS:

- **1st Vice President - Speakers & Workshops:** Paula Ferry reported there were 3 spaces open in the two day workshop this weekend with Laura Fogg. She described Laura Fogg's workshop and directed members to Laura's table with materials and greeting cards of her work. Paula reviewed the upcoming speakers and workshops including Heather Black in July and Karen

Combs in September and she has sign up sheets for their workshops. She has reserved Peggy Gelbrecht, an Oregon quilter, for January 2020 and Laura Heine from Billings, Montana for April 2020. Laura will be teaching collage classes from her "Teeny Tiny" series. Laura's classes will have an additional fee of \$25 for the pattern with three designs and a \$35 fabric kit, available in class.

- **2nd Vice President - Quilt Show:** Anita Pederson said that Quilt Show registration is now open and quilts can be entered on paper or online but online is preferred. 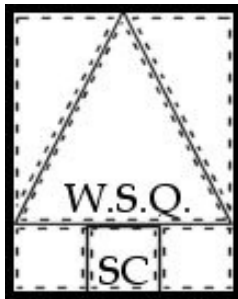
