Our April meeting will also be via Zoom. The Board has decided to opt out of an in-person meeting for April because of fluctuating COVID requirements, in hopes that things will be better by July. In order to attend our meeting in April, you must be a registered member of WSQ so that you can receive an invitation to the Zoom meeting.

We would like to make a change to the By Laws regarding Charity Central. This is spelled out on page 16 of the Newsletter. Be sure to read it and be ready to vote on the change.

We would also like to welcome to the Board our new Shop Hop Committee. The American Sewing Guild has decided to disband their Spokane Chapter and we have been asked to take over the Shop Hop activity. The former ASG members form the core of this committee, but WSQ members are always welcome.

We have moved our storage unit from its old location on S McDonald Rd to a climate-controlled



space at Secure It Self Storage on Broadway. We are trying to collect all the WSQ property from wherever it has been stored so that it will be in a central location and accessible to all. We need the climate-controlled feature because our cash registers for the quilt show, our library books, and our history scrap books will all be stored there. These items do not do well when stored where the temperature fluctuates as it does in our old storage unit. If you have WSQ property stored in your house, please contact us so that we can put it with the rest of our property. If you have keys to the old storage unit, please turn them in to one of the Board members. Those keys and codes will not work at the new place.

Annie Sanders has agreed to edit our Newsletter for us. She has not done a newsletter before but is willing to try. If anyone would like to help Annie with this, she would be delighted to hear from you. Thank you, Annie, for stepping forward. This is the second of four full newsletters we are planning for this year.

We are still in need of a Raffle Quilt Chair for 2022. We have the quilt already; we just need someone to get it quilted and to steer it through the raffle phase. At the rate we are going, it may be the Raffle Quilt for 2023, but I sincerely hope not!

Finish Your BOM Friday, April 23, 9-4 pm

Have you participated in a Block-of-the-Month program and now you're wondering how to finish your quilt? Using the Quilt-As-You-Go technique, we will quilt each block individually with your walking foot and straight line quilting.

Crazy Quilt-As-You-Go Saturday, April 24, 9-4 pm

Make a beautiful crazy quilt completely by machine. This is a great chance to use all those wonderful built-in stitches on your machine to embellish and quilt your blocks in one step. Using the *Quilt-As-You-Go* technique, each block is quilted individually then joined together with a special sashing technique. This is a great technique for quilting larger quilts in smaller, manageable sections. Choose the project size that is right for you: large quilt, lap quilt, or a table runner and placemats.




Future Speakers

2021 Annual Quilt Show Report

October 15, 16, & 17, 2021

I would like to thank everyone who has volunteered to help with this years quilt show. I still have 3 Committee Chair vacancies that need to be filled. (Cashier, Registration, Set-up)

I talked with Spokane Interstate Fairgrounds and Expo Center last week.

We were in Phase II, and they have given me the guidelines for what our show would look like at this phase. I have not received information for Phase III yet. We will make a final decision about having the 2021 Quilt Show at our June 9th Board Meeting. We will be reviewing and/or tweaking the budget to make a sound financial decision. I will not be spending any funds until that decision has been made. Which means, the 2021 Quilt Show pins purchase is still on hold.

Registration

Opens: April 22 Closes: Aug 8

Traditional Quilt Show Registration begins at our April meeting. With the hopes of having a show this year, we will post the PDF registration form to the website. We are not printing any forms at this time due to the unknown questions regarding the 2021 Quilt Show. I am hoping to have the on-line registration up and running by April 22nd as well. Since we did not have a show last year, I am expecting that we all have a lot of quilts to enter this year. I would ask that you keep your entries down to 3 quilts to give everyone a chance to enter the show. At the July meeting, if our entry numbers have not reached 600, I will open it back up so you can enter more quilts.

This year our featured category is "Hand Appliqué". Requirements are as follows: Any type of appliqué as long as it is done by hand. For example: needle turn appliqué / fusible appliqué / reverse appliqué / freezer paper appliqué. Appliqué should be the main focus of the quilt. Minimum size: 36" x 36". (W2 x L2 = 144" or greater)

Storage Unit

With our current storage unit lease ending, Kathleen and I have located a 10° x 15° climate controlled unit at Secure It Self Storage, 15702 E Broadway just off of Sullivan Road in the Spokane Valley. We needed a climate controlled unit to store the cash registers and other equipment for the quilt show that have LCD screens. We will be transferring the items in the current storage unit to the new location in the next few weeks. We will be organizing the contents to make it more user friendly for the truck driver when items are brought to the Quilt Show and for the Librarian to pick up and store our library.

We have kits with backing and/or batting in them. You just need to decide how much you would be able to do and let us know. If you can't pick up we will try to deliver them to you. If you would like to come and select fabric for you charity quilt you can do that also.

If you have some quilts or kits that you picked up at our meetings and know that you are not able to finish them please return them to us.

Treasurer's Report

I am so glad to be welcoming the bright colors of SPRING and pleased to serve the guild as the 2021 & 2022 treasurer. I want to share some thoughts I have had over the past year relating to dues.

Many places where my family has paid 'dues' in 2020 had limited meetings and/or did not meet at all. It was sad, and to be honest there were times I was frustrated! It caused me to really consider my involvement and contributions to those organizations. As I did so, I saw a need to 're-focus' my expectations. Not just that but what I wanted from them and even to recognize that I was quite demanding of service, or the lack there of in 2020, from those organizations.

Consider these definitions provided by the Cambridge dictionary:

- Dues: the payments that someone makes in order to belong to an organization.
- Fees: an amount of money paid for a particular piece of work or for a particular right or service.

I have considered my 'dues' as a 'fee', believing that these organizations 'owe' me something-that I was paying for a 'right or service'. Simple difference in definition, but easy to interchange in the mind, causing misunderstanding for sure.

WSQ bi-Laws state that you become a member of the organization by paying dues. I found this to be true in all organizations where any of my family members paid dues. Dues = membership. Membership in every organization was very different from the expected last year! That doesn't mean it was useless, or without purpose.

I am very appreciative and thankful for every member who willingly paid dues in 2020 knowing it was possible we wouldn't continue to have meetings. I came to the realization that my dues payments helped to keep WSQ and many of those other organizations afloat in 2020. It allowed those organizations to STILL be here in 2021, and hopefully beyond.

The Global Quilt Connection group will be hosting a Virtual Sampler Platter on May 22 and 23, 2021 from noon to 3pm Pacific time. They have scheduled 18 quilt teachers, who will demonstrate some of their favorite quilting techniques over the two days. There will be a wide variety of styles and techniques presented from traditional to modern and art quilting techniques. Something to please everyone! Proposed Standing Rules Amendment

As Kathleen mentioned in her article, the board has recommended changes to our Standing Rules to reflect what the Charity Central Committee is actually doing. Be ready to vote on this at April's zoom meeting.

RATIONALE: Charity Central accepts quilting fabric and supplies from anyone willing to donate. The committee takes the donated fabric and uses it to make quilt kits for distribution to members. The members take those kits and assemble quilt tops. The quilt tops, along with batting, backing, and binding are picked up by those willing to quilt them and then return them to Charity Central once the quilting is done. The binding may be done by someone else.

Charity Central has a list of organizations that would like quilts to give away or to use as a raffle quilt for the purpose of fund raising for that organization.

Because of budget concerns, WSQ has not accepted requests for cash donations as stated in the current Standing Rules for several years.



The store manager asked Kristin if she would be interested in teaching the sewing machine mastery courses they provided with the purchase of a new machine. That sounded like a great way to meet people, so Kristin began teaching classes on weekends. Since the students had all makes and models of sewing machines, it gave her a familiarity with many machines.

After making a few quilts, Kristin became intrigued by a technique she saw on TV. The concept was to quilt the quilt in small sections and then join the sections with sashing strips to cover the raw edges. She was hooked and began researching the many ways this technique was achieved. It is often referred to as "quilt-as-you-go" or "reversible" quilting.

After participating in a number of block-of-the-month programs, she decided to design a setting for her completed blocks that would make use of the quilt-as-you-go technique. When Kristin showed the ladies at the quilt shop, they insisted she create and teach a class, and her "Finish Your Block-of-the Month" class was born. It continues to her most popular class, and the success of that class has led her to design other quilts based on the technique.

Kristin recently retired from the County of Sacramento where she spent 23 years as a computer geek. When not quilting or teaching, she enjoys spending time with her husband Shawn, their three grown children and two grandkids. They live on 18 acres in beautiful Worley, Idaho where they enjoy gardening and raising chickens.
