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WSQ Welcomes Robin Long



What started as a quest to make a Mariner's Compass Quilt for her submarine officer husband, Robin Long took an idea she had in 1992 and launched Robin Ruth Design in January, 2015. She has developed a line of revolutionary rulers, books, patterns, and technique for making STRIP PIECED mariner's compass blocks in 16 sizes – that's right, NO PAPER PIECING! When she isn't on the road giving workshops, she is working on many new projects that bring the mariner's compass into the 21st century. Her products are sold in quilt shops across the U.S. and around the world.

Her system of rulers begins with the Skinny Robin 16-Point and Fat Robin 16-Point Mariner's Compass Book and Ruler combos; each used to create slightly different mariner's compass blocks in 16 sizes (from 6"-36") using the same process. The only difference is that Skinny Robin is based on a 45° angle and Fat Robin is based on a 60° angle. This revolutionary strip-piecing method enables you to make the once tedious and unapproachable mariner's compass block quickly and accurately. Now you will be able to easily incorporate these blocks into your own creative quilt project! Mariner's Compass Book and Ruler combo required for this class. It is to foster the conservation and preservation of quilts and increase public awareness and appreciation of quilts through our Quilt Show.

From the President

Welcome to a bright and shiny New Year! We are all hoping for better things this year. Our next Membership meeting will take place on January 28 and will be conducted virtually via Zoom. All current members for 2020 will be sent an invitation for the meeting with a link to connect. We will have both the afternoon and evening meeting at the regular times. Zoom is easy to navigate and you do not need to use video to see and hear what is going on. We plan to have the business meeting, followed by the Speaker's presentation, and ending with Show and Tell. We will need to vote on the 2021 Budget which is included in this newsletter. You will be asked to vote to accept the budget by using the thumbs up icon on Zoom. To participate in Show and Tell, send pictures of your finished quilts (limit 3 pieces please!) to Kris-



tin Echols at <u>webmaster@WSQSpokane.org</u> with "January Show and Tell" in the subject line. She will put together a power point presentation of all the pictures. Please have the labeled pictures to Kristin by January 21, a week before the meeting. Include your name and anything you want to say about the quilts. See Kristin's article about the web site for further instructions on how to attend a Zoom meeting. I look forward to seeing you all again!

We always have questions when we present the Budget on why we have such large cash reserves. This past year is a perfect example of why we have extra cash. We had no idea we would need to cancel everything last year. Expenses were incurred early in the year that we were not able to recoup later. Ongoing, unseen expenses, such as insurance coverage and storage unit fees, had to be paid regardless of our activity level. Because of our reserves, we were able to come through this storm unscathed. Other organizations have had to fold, but we are still healthy. In order to stay healthy, we are asking that you renew your membership for 2021, and we will do our best to give you good reasons for doing so.

After much discussion and crystal ball gazing, the Board has decided on the shape we hope 2021 will take. After being dormant for most of last year while we waited for all of this to be over, we have decided to be more pro active this year. As a result, our January membership meeting and workshops will be done virtually. We will put out four full issues of our newsletter. Our April meeting is a question as to the form it will take—in person, virtual, or a combination of both—but it will take place. Check the April Newsletter for details. In order to get a Zoom invitation for the April meeting, you will need to have renewed your membership for 2021. You can do this on the website or mail in the renewal included in this Newsletter. We are really hoping things will be back to normal by our July meeting and that it, and the September meeting, will take place in person. We are going ahead with our Quilt Show planning as if the show will take place as usual. We may switch gears later in the year to go virtual, but we are planning to have a show of some sort. By that time, we will all be experts at doing things virtually.

Many of our other activities should come back in one form or another. Our Charity Quilt Challenge "20 in 2020" will continue until we can meet in person again. You can contact JoAnn Sandstrom to drop off your quilts. The community need continues, despite social distancing. Be sure to let her know if your donations are to be counted for the Challenge. The "Mommy and Me" team (my team) has about 30 quilts to our credit and more are coming. How are you doing? Quilting Bees are hoping to be back in business before the end of the year. There will be a Yard Sale at some point, so get your things ready for that. We did not sell any raffle tickets on our "Farmer's Wife" quilt last year and so have rolled it over to this year. There will probably not be any Bus Trips or retreats in 2021. We are planning on having a booth at the Spokane Interstate Fair, if they have a Fair. We have ribbons to give out in our regional Fairs, so get your entries ready.

We have had a couple of changes in our Executive Board. Please welcome Darlene Mossman as our new First Vice President of Speakers and Workshops, and Vicki Trudel as our Treasurer. The Board appointed these ladies to their positions as we do when someone must step down during the year. We plan to have an election for the entire Executive Board in September. If you are interested in any of the positions—President, Speakers, Quilt Show, Secretary, Treasurer—we are interested in speaking to you. After the confusion of the last year, all our committees need help. We are especially in need of a Newsletter editor. It is exceedingly difficult to get out a quality newsletter when no one is in charge. Ruth, our temporary newsletter editor, is doing a great job, but she has other duties to fulfill. We need a Raffle Quilt Chair for 2022. We have a "Flowers in the Cabin" quilt donated by the estate of Ginger Patano. We need someone to get it quilted and guide it through the raffle process in 2022. There will be members of all committees who are not willing or able to attend meetings in person, even when the venues open again, so co-chairs will be especially important at this time. We need you now more than ever! If you can help with anything, we would surely appreciate it.

In December, I recorded a chat with Bonnie Browning of American Quilters Society on their "Guild Buzz with Bonnie" series. It premiered on December 23 on Facebook. You can find the link on YouTube.com/quiltTV. Take a look and let me know how I did.

So, here's hoping for a stellar year, as WSQ comes roaring back to life! Come along with me, the best is yet to be! See you soon!

Strip-Pieced Sunflowers * * * Skill Level - Intermediate

(Students should have completed a couple of previous quilt projects. Good rotary cutting skills and accurate

sewing are a plus for this class.)

Class Description

Create your very own stunning sunflower garden using Robin Ruth Design's innovative strip-piecing method and rulers for making this variation on the mariner's compass block. We'll spend the day creating Fat Robin Sunflowers for your own fabulous garden. Students will learn this raw edge appliqué method for finishing their blocks and I will also give ideas for shaping these flowers into other shapes

and embellishing these gardens with other appliqué shapes (including bias stems and shaped leaves).

After an interesting spring and much research, the 2020 Annual Quilt Show was cancelled at the August board meeting.

The committee had spent some money early in the year not knowing that we would be cancelling the show. Total expenditures related to the quilt show were \$4,438.05. These expenditures include the 2020 Quilt Show Pins, 1st 100 Pins, the Posters and Bookmarks, the storage unit, and a new printer for ribbon labels.

Fifty-nine people entered the quilt show and earned a First 100 Pin. We did not budget to mail these pins so we will be handing them out when we are allowed to meet in person. I appreciate all the work that the Quilt Show Committee put into the show that we had to cancel.

December 9, 2020 Board Meeting - Virtual meeting via Zoom

CALL TO ORDER: The Board Meeting was called to order at 6:09 pm by President Kathleen Woods.

Approval of the minutes of March 2020: Motion made by Patty Yedinak; seconded by Colleen Musetter. Approved by all.

OFFICER REPORTS

President: Kathleen Woods

A motion was made by Patty Yedinak to appoint Darlene Mossman as 1st VP and Vicki Trudel as Treasurer. The motion was seconded by Anita Pederson and approved by all.

Discussion of having the January member meetings by Zoom. Items to consider include what to include and how to do it. It was decided to keep our regular format, with the change of Show & tell using PowerPoint. The Speaker will not be recorded for the January meeting, by her preference. Budget: Cheryl Clossin – Without a crystal ball it is hard to know how to budget for 2021. The General Budget assumes the following:

- January Guild meeting and classes will be held virtually.
- We might have an April meeting with some limitations. Kristin's classes will be virtual.
- There will be no bus trips or retreats for 2021 due to the Pandemic.
- Fundraising is funded because we will be selling Quilt Show pins, t-shirts & other items. We hope to sell these at July and September Guild meetings.
- We will attempt to sell raffle tickets during available guild meetings, other events, and the Quilt Show.
- The Yard Sale will be moved to later in the year if we cannot do it in March.

The Quilt Show budget was prepared as though we will be able to hold it as usual. This may not be practical, but we anticipate that we will have a show, even with limitations. If there are limitations, we may lose money. This will come out of reserve funds. We feel that is important for continuity to have the show AND keep our members and attendees as safe as possible.

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Notes on 2021 Budget

On December 2, 2020, my budget committee, which included Kathleen Woods, Nancy Ledeboer, Paula Ferry, Darlene Mossman, and Anita Pederson, met via Zoom to prepare the 2021 WSQ budget.

The process of preparing the 2021 budget consists of the committee carefully comparing the current year's budget with the actual income and expenditures for the current year and then we typically review the 2021 budget requests of the various committees for both the General and Quilt Show budgets relative to that comparison as well as the needs of the guild. Then the budget is prepared for the presentation to the board for approval. Obviously 2020 was a challenging year and so with no quilt show but some expenditures related to it as well as no guild meetings after January, this was a difficult endeavor.

The 2021 WSQ Budget was presented to the board virtually via Zoom on December 9, 2020 and after discussion, both budgets were unanimously passed.

We made several assumptions in attempting to prepare this budget and the numbers presented are based upon these assumptions which I have detailed below:

• **General Budget** – We prepared this budget based on having a virtual Zoom guild meeting in January and most likely in April and hopefully we would be able to resume normal meetings in July and September. Accordingly, expenses for Centerplace and expenses related to in person meetings are calculated on only 2 meetings.

• There is no budget for Bus trips because Linda felt that we would not be able to do this based on current restrictions and with possibly delayed guild meetings, we would not get the sign-ups for a retreat.

• We need to encourage full payment of membership dues for 2021 as we will be offering many of the events we usually have either virtually or hopefully, in person. Many of the expenses we need to pay will come out of this income. However, you will see that the budgeted income was still only \$10,000 which is lower than usual.

• We will attempt to sell raffle tickets for the 2020 raffle quilt during in person meetings and other events as things open up. This is the quilt that was held over from this year.

• The Yard Sale is scheduled for the end of March, but the venue is working with Colleen and if we are unable to do it at that time, it will still be held at a later date, when available.

• We always include a budgeted line item in both the General and Quilt show budgets – which is 'Other'. This is the amount of expected profit we need from the Quilt Show to fund the shortfall in the General Budget. This amount for 2021 is \$3,472.75 which is approximately the shortfall in membership dues and other income producing events. There is a new line item also – Funds from Reserves to cover Shortfall which is \$2,010.25 which is the amount we will need to use from our reserves to cover the rest of the shortfall.

• **Quilt Show** – after much discussion back and forth on whether we could hold the show, we decided to prepare the budget as if we could have a full show with all the vendors and expected admissions. However, we also discussed what the budget would look like if we were able to have the show but with limited vendors and other safety protocols. We will proceed either way with the 2021 show if allowed and adjust the budget as necessary based on those limitations.

Reserves – The discussion about our CD's in reserves as well as bank balances comes up often when reports are given as it relates to dues, quilt show entry and other budget expenses. The reason we have been so strict with a good budget and the goal of never touching our reserves to cover shortfalls; is just such an event as this year. We had shortages in both the general and quilt show budgets for 2020 due to the pandemic and shut down. Reserves were used to cover these expenses. If we end up having limitations in the Quilt Show and as a result lose income with expenses being the same, we will need to use our reserves again to cover these expenses. This is the same thing with membership dues and other General Budget fundraising events. We have many expenses in the general budget that must be paid regardless of income. If we do not get the anticipated income as budgeted, we will again need to use our reserves to cover these expenses.

Without our reserves, we would have been in dire straits to keep the guild going and any funds used for expenses will hopefully be rebuilt in future years.

Capital Account – The Capital Account is a savings account funded by excess profits from the Quilt Show, not used to balance the General Budget. This account was set up to cover one-of-a kind expenses for both budgets. Our new website was fully funded out of the Capital account without having to use reserves. There were several items budgeted for in 2020 for the quilt show which will still be funded for 2021 out of this account without using reserves. These include several items for Demos, new card readers and tablets for processing credit card payments at various places at the show and Quilt Display Stands. This totals \$1,125. The final payment for the website of \$2,050 will also be paid out of this account.

I would like to thank my committee for the help and insight they provide in the preparation of this budget as well as our board for the hard work they do throughout the year to support the guild. And our first virtual committee and board meeting went surprisingly well with few glitches and I wanted to thank Kristin Echols for moderating and keeping us all on track.
