President's Message

Welcome Summer! The WSQ Board has been hard at work to provide activities for our members. Most of them have been virtual but we have hopes to meet in person soon! Our July Membership meeting on July 22 will be via Zoom with Linda Hahn as our Speaker. All current WSQ members will receive an invitation to the meeting. To use Zoom, all you have to do is click on the link and it will bring you there. It is very easy to use, you don't have to be on video if you choose not to, and it is so much fun to see all those familiar faces you haven't seen in so long! If you can get an email or shop online, you can use Zoom. If you do not have Internet capability, perhaps some of your friends do. Get together with them and see what is going on. We had 61 attendees at our April meeting out of a membership of over 250. I hope that you will give it a try, we would love to see you.

At our April meeting, we took several polls of those attending and have made some Board decisions based on those numbers. It was not a very big sampling of the Membership, but it was the best we could do. Based on those numbers, we decided that a virtual meeting in July was our best option. We have decided to make the January meeting virtual on a permanent basis and have selected Speakers for those months accordingly. We may be able to pull in Speakers we could not afford before if we do it virtually, maybe even someone from Europe or Australia.

The Board has decided to hold our annual Quilt Show on October 15,16, and 17, 2021. We are starting the planning process late and there may be some things we cannot do, and some things may be different than the way we have done them before. We may incur a financial loss but have decided that this is the rainy day we have been saving our money for. We need your help more than ever. We usually have over 300 volunteers and this year we only have 280 members. Anita has more information on the help she needs. Whatever you can do will be greatly appreciated!

The Fair committee has decided not to participate in the Spokane Interstate Fair this year. There are a lot of questions as to protocols and the committee did not think they would be able to get the 65 volunteers they needed in time. We are hoping for better luck next year.

We are offering ribbons in at least 8 local Fairs.

We are hosting a Shop Hop on August 13,14, and 15. This is the Shop Hop usually put on by the American Sewing Guild. There are 20 shops participating.

We are hoping to have a bus trip to some of the outlying shops next year. We will be having a Quilting Bee on August 7 at the Country Homes Christian Church.

Raffle tickets for the Farmer's Wife quilt are on sale. Tickets will be for sale until the last day of the Quilt Show when the winner will be picked. Be sure to get your tickets as soon as you can. Cathy Anderson could use some help with getting the quilt out and about. We also need a Raffle Quilt Chair for 2022. The quilt is already made, it just needs to be quilted.

We are hopeful to have our Yard Sale once again on October 30, depending on SFCC's ability to host large groups. Things are beginning to firm up and the light at the end of the tunnel is getting brighter. It has been a long road, but I think we are nearing the end of it. We plan to have our September meeting in person and start to get back to normal. More information about September in the next newsletter. In the meantime, enjoy your summer to the fullest!

Students will then learn Linda's technique for foundation piecing using paper (in the kit) that can be left in the quilt.

Students will work on preparing the different color quilt blocks which are laid out and assembled into the quilt top after all the blocks are made.

I am excited to announce that we are having our 2021 Quilt Show. Mark your calendar to join me at the Spokane Interstate Fair and Expo Center which has been reserved for our show, "Harvesting Quilts" to be held October 15 - 17, 2021.

Even though we are five months behind on planning this years show, we are making progress. Vendors have been contacted, quilt show pin artwork has been submitted for the mock up designs, bookmarks and posters have been ordered, and we are getting the word out that we are having our show this year.

Shelley Sieverkropp has graciously agreed to be our featured quilter again this year. Shelley is the wife of a farmer/rancher in Lincoln County, a quilt instructor at Macine Quilters Exposition (MQX) and Utah Sewing and Quilting Marketplace (UQSM), and is a great piecer and machine quilter.

On-line registration is now open and will ends on Aug 8th. You can also sign up to have your quilt judged by a professional judge for \$10 per quilt when registering your quilt.

Treasurer's Report

Imagine, you are the 'new' WSQ treasurer and you get an email from Kathleen, WSQ president asking for some 'gift cards' that she needs to give to people, and to just send the codes as she is out of town. As the treasurer you know this goes against the WSQ 'policies & procedures', but being new-you proceed cautiously. Emailing back and asking questions, also picking up the phone to discuss it 'in person'. You notice, this request has her FULL name, and is signed President of WSQ **BUT** it is has been sent from an email address that you are not familiar with (even though it has her name on it, and it is gmail.com) After speaking with Kathleen, who laughed and said "No-not me- I wouldn't request that!" -- you realize that WSQ has been the target of financial fraud. It was pretty smooth-it wasn't the only incident either. Multiple requests have come through, with people identifying themselves as someone on our board, or a committee.

Due to these events I decided to attend a webinar offered by Washington Trust Bank titled 'Email Hacking & Financial Fraud'. It discussed how cybercriminals are real, very active, and seeking to get large amounts of money from you.

In the past WSQ's financial data has been listed in our webpage- via the newsletter. It is also verbally reported at our Membership Meeting Minutes-and thus recorded in those minutes, that are also in our newsletter for membership approval. This makes our financial data public, which needs to be kept private to our membership only. Immediately, WSQ will not list in a public manner our account or CD balances. This information will no longer be listed in our newsletter. The board will be discussing ways to provide this to members only in the future. However, as a member you may contact treasurer@wsqspokane.org and I will be glad to discuss our financial standing with you.

I am reporting that WSQ is in good financial standing, all accounts have been reconciled and will be submitted to the president for audit. The board continues to closely consider how to keep WSQ an exciting, viable, and long-lived organization. We are looking forward to the Shop Hop this year, as well as our Quilt Show. Be sure to join in the fun, and volunteer to share the fun behind the scenes. Thank you for your commitment to WSQ in 2020 & 2021!


