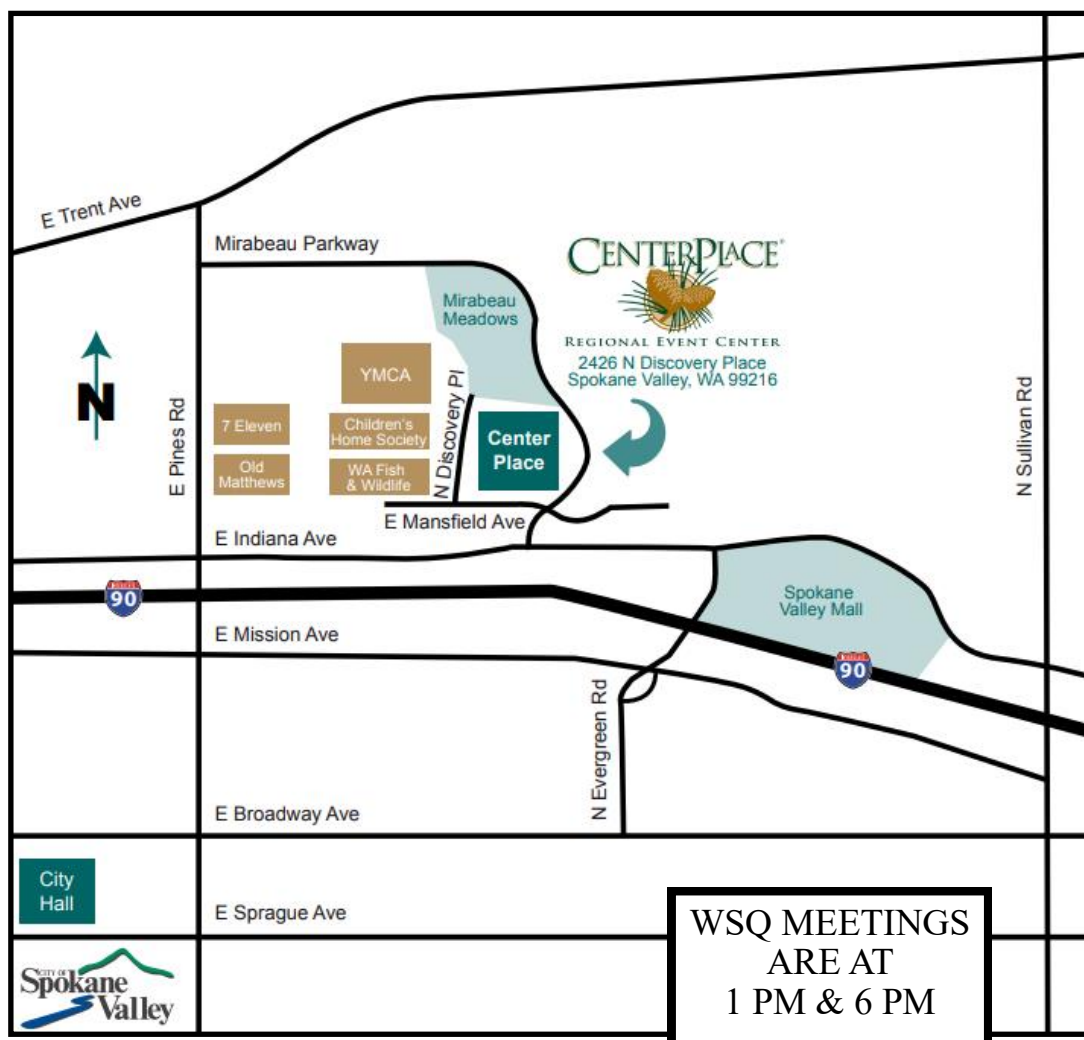

WSQ Welcomes Krista Moser

Krista Moser will be with us, live and in person, in September for a lecture on 9/23 at 1pm and again at 6pm at Center Place.

She is the creative force and inspiration behind *The Quilted Life*. A quilting and fiber arts enthusiast, she started sewing at 8 years old, sneaking off to the sewing machine during her mom's nap time. Since she couldn't read patterns, everything was made from her imagination, propelling the creativity and the innovative design she is known for today.

She began her professional sewing and machine quilting career at the spunky age of fourteen, adding the texture and dimension machine quilting brings to every project.

She has been teaching sewing and quilting lessons for more than twenty years. Her work has been featured in quilting magazines, published by Martingale Press, and hung in prominent quilt shops around the country.

It's probably genetic and the grandmas would be proud. What a life this *Quilted Life* is, and what a joy to share the journey!



Krista will be teaching a 2-day class on her beautiful pattern Bumblebee Blossoms on Friday 9/24 and Saturday 9/25 at the Spokane Hampton Inn. The cost of the downloadable pattern is \$12, however she will provide a code for a 50% discount for students. The tuition for the workshop is \$130 for the two-day class.



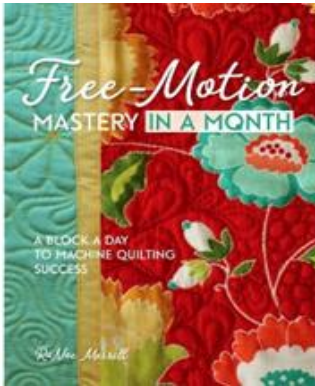

The Global Quilt Connection group will once again be hosting a Virtual Sampler Platter on October 2nd and 3rd, 2021 from noon to 3pm Pacific time.

They have scheduled 18 quilt teachers, who will demonstrate some of their favorite quilting techniques over the two days. There will be a wide variety of styles and techniques presented from traditional to modern and art quilting techniques. Something to please everyone!

WSQ will also receive a PDF to share with our guild members that will include written instructions to go along with each teacher's demonstration. WSG has paid the \$150 (that is the total cost for the whole membership) and it will be open to all of our members.

This event is meant to encourage members to try out virtual learning. Please check the WSQ website for login info. Perhaps several of you would like to get together and watch, to help those who are unfamiliar with Zoom and/or do not have access to it. You will be able to spend the whole time viewing the presentations, or come and go as you need. The live Zoom meeting will have a 1,000 person access limit at any one time. If the meeting is full when you log in, you will be directed to a Youtube livestream and won't miss a thing! They will have moderators on board to make sure the viewer experience is as smooth as possible. Note that this will be a Zoom meeting, not a webinar. This event will not be recorded. I encourage all members to take advantage of this awesome opportunity!

It's hard to believe that in just a little over a month we will be enjoying this year's show. The Quilt Show Committee is hard at work to make this year's show a success, and I feel blessed to have had the privilege to work with each member of the committee. I want to thank each of you for entering your quilts into the show. With the short notice of letting everyone know we were holding this year's show, the number of quilts entered are down from our normal number of around 500 quilts. With around 400 quilts entered into this year's show, 18 entries are in our Featured Category of *Hand Appliquéd Project*. I am looking forward to seeing all the quilts on display.

A few of our favorite vendors over the past year and a half have decided to no longer do shows, retired, or have gone out of business. 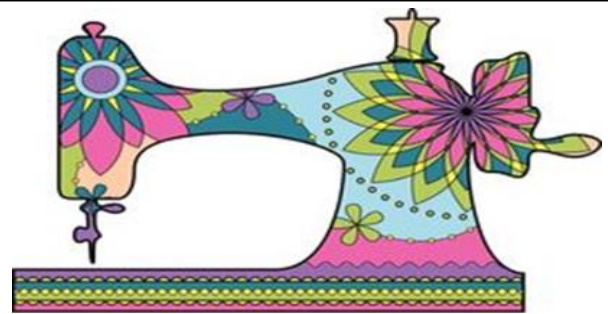

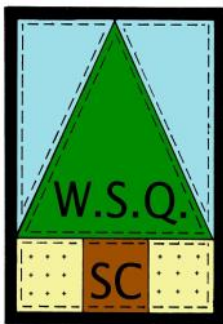

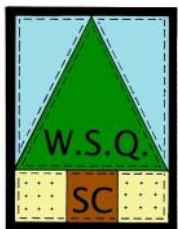
