Stitch 'n Tin

WSQ Presents Shelley Swanland July 27, 2023, 1pm & 6pm

For more than twenty years Shelley has been creating Cathedral Window Quilts entirely by machine. The technique uses three-dimensional piecing to construct the top, and during quilting, the bias folds are rolled and stitched in place to create a finished quilt.

Shelley has been involved in quilting and embroidering since the 70s. When silk ribbon embroidery became popular, she fell in love with the technique, creating projects and



teaching. She combined her love of quilting with embroidery and embellishment to create Wearable Art. An ensemble she entered in Pacific International won 2nd Place. In the late 90s she developed a technique for Cathedral Window quilts done entirely by machine. Two books followed, Machine Stitched Cathedral Windows and Machine Stitched Cathedral Stars. She appeared on Simply Quilts and her projects were featured in McCall's Quilting, Quiltmaker and The Quilter. RJR Fashion Fabrics and Robert Kaufman Fabrics have invited her to design quilts for their publications. She has been traveling to guilds to lecture and teach the Cathedral Window technique for almost twenty years. In the last ten years she has returned to her love of Embellishment and Embroidery adding a Lecture and Workshop focused on these techniques.

Hello Fellow Quilters. As we continue preparations for the quilt show, we need your help. If you haven't heard, it takes 300+ volunteers to put on a show of this magnitude. Help us make the quilt show a success. The Quilt Show Committee Chairs/Co-Chairs will be available to answer any questions and sign you up for a shift or two. A wonderful perk of volunteering 4 or more hours is FREE admission & FREE parking all three days of the show.



The deadline for registering your quilt(s) is fast approaching. Registration closes August 6th. There are two ways to register: online or download a form & mail it in. The maximum number of quilts you can enter is 5 per person. If you have questions, contact me at secondvp@wsqspokane.org.

You can have your quilts judged by a Professional Quilt Judge for \$10 per quilt. Check the box on the form and pay when you drop off your quilt at your chosen drop off location. Rest assured your judged quilt is still eligible to win a ribbon in the show.

A Message from the Quilt Show Boutique team:



Charity Central - July 2023

Charity Central July Newsletter 2023

We collected and donated 109 finished quilts this quarter. We gave 15 to Cancer Center NW, 5 to Vanessa Behan, 10 to Transitions Women's Drop In Center, 35 to Catholic Charities, 3 to Hospice, 30 to the Salvation Army, 3 to Sacred Heart Hospital, and 8 to Refugee Connections.

We currently have about 30 quilts to be quilted, about 10 quilts that need binding, and about 100 quilt tops needing backing and batting. We have received many donations of batting and backing. Thank you to those who donated, it is greatly appreciated!

We hosted 2 Sew Days this quarter, one sponsored by Charity Central and one in conjunction with the Quilting Bee. We had about 30 attendees total, and many kits were pieced and picked up.

Block Exchange will have four kits available that Charity Central put together using the 21 churn dash blocks that were turned in at the last meeting. These quilts were a special request from the Cancer Center. We are currently working on more kits for your sewing pleasure, some will be using Shabby Fabrics fusible hearts, and some will be scrappy squares. We plan to have them available at the July meeting. We will also have several sets of vintage blocks for sale as well as our One Pound Bundles. We are in the process of cleaning out everything that we have been given that we cannot use to make charity quilts. We will be having a "Year End Clearance Sale" in September to finish up this process. We want to have a leaner, cleaner stash and a smaller storage unit. Less money for rent means more money for batting!

We currently have 345 members on our Charity Central Facebook page. It's been so much fun to see what everyone is working on and to see the quilts that get turned in at the meeting. There are many people posting pictures, sharing patterns and links, and commenting on everything that is going on. We have an active committee of about 12 members. We spend a lot of time cutting, sorting, and packaging fabric. Sometimes, we even get to sew some! Thank you all for all you do for Charity Central and the Spokane Community. We couldn't do it without you!

WSQ GENERAL MEETING MINUTES CENTERPLACE 04/27/2023

Call to order 1.02pm and 6.00 pm

Paula Ferry, President: Welcomed all, including new members and guests. Officers were introduced and displays around the room were pointed out.

Paula also presented to the membership why we had to raise the admission to the WSQ Quilt show from \$10.00 to \$15.00. Prices have risen, and we are finding the vendors have higher expenses. Some vendors are not returning because of age, retirement, or higher costs, so we didn't feel it was in our best interest to raise their fees. She also noted that we buy the parking lot so that we do not have to charge for parking. That is a \$5.00 a day saving for everyone.

Our Volunteer of the Quarter was introduced: Ruth McCormick was awarded a thank you certificate, a heart in hand pin, and a gift certificate for a free workshop.

January 26, 2023 minutes were approved as submitted.

Executive Board Reports:

1st Vice President, Darlene Mossman told us about the speakers coming for the next four general meetings in 2023 and 2024. She talked about the mystery quilt. Clues are being sent this weekend and the last clues will go out in July. There is a special entry category on the quilt show registration form for the Wandering Grace mystery quilts made by members. She also mentioned that the Global Quilt Connection is free to members and will be May 6 and 7, 2023.

2nd Vice President, Patty Yedinak: Quilt Show preparations are in full swing. There are lots of opportunities to sign up to volunteer, register your quilts, buy a quilt show pin, register items to sell in the Boutique, and help distribute Quilt Show Bookmarks and Posters to your family, friends, or anywhere your travels take you. When you volunteer a minimum of 4 hours during set up and/or during the Quilt show, you get free admission and free parking all three days of the show. Volunteering is a great way to get involved, meet new people and reconnect with old friends. Please see the ladies at the back of the room for more details. If you have questions, please ask. The 2023 Farm Girl Quilt show pin at the Fund-Raising Table for \$5.00. There are 2 ways to register your quilts...online or paper form. The on-line option is fast, efficient and easy. Go the WSQ website, click on Quilt Show, click register your quilt and then follow the prompts. We also have paper forms available today. Remember to register early, the first 100 quilts entered will receive a collectible 1st 100 specially designed pin for the quilt show. There is a 5-quilt maximum for the 2023 show.

Treasurer, Diane Pantry: I have reconciled two months' bank statements and found no errors or issues. The current balance is adequate to cover immediate WSQ commitments. If any member wishes to see the bank balances and discuss any issues, please come see me. This week I will send out income and expense reports to be reviewed by the chairmen of the three activities that have been completed this year...Retreat, Yard Sale, and Shop Hop. A couple of the chairs have gotten back to me, letting me know they have some outstanding bills but even accounting for those amounts...great job! The income generated more than covered their expenses; they added a little to the bank account which helps cover our overheads. This is important so that we can recoup the losses incurred during the two years of COVID. Thanks for all your work. I am working on a list of procedures, policies, and instructions regarding financial issues so that chairmen have a better understanding of how this part of the process works. If anyone has something they would like for me to include, let me know.

Committee Reports

Fair Ribbons/Bagging Party /IN Memoriam, Cheryl Moriarty: The 2023 fair dates for all of the fairs that we support have been updated on the website. Many links to the fair exhibitor guide/entry forms are

current, while some of the fairs have not updated their forms. (The fairs are in August and September, but some of the booklets do not come out until May or June, so keep checking back) The ribbons have been ordered and will be sent or delivered to the fairs in early August.

The bagging party for the quilt show will be on Thursday September 14 starting at 8:30 AM. The location is not yet confirmed, but we should have it by the July meeting.

The "In Memoriam" section of the quilt show so far includes seven (7) ladies who have passed away within the last year or so. We will be honoring them at this years' quilt show. If anyone knows of a quilter who should be added to this list, please let me know.

Librarian, Lois Collins: we have lots of books, take one for \$1.00, read it bring it back and get another. We have magazines also for .25 cents.

Lorean Boornazian: Margie Karavitas award...there is a committee set up who will present the award following various criteria that features hand work.

Raffle Quilt 2023, Shawna Troyer needs volunteers to help her sell raffle tickets at the various places she has set up.

Ballot Counting Chair, Brenda Burger has changed the hours for ballot counting...they will be afternoon hours only Friday and Saturday

WSQ Challenge, Naomi Hall: What's on your barn? She has pieces of red barn fabric for \$1, or a fat quarter for \$2.

Cashier: Beth West is adding 2 cashier lines, one for cash and one for credit card so that it will run more smoothly.

Block Exchange, Mary Applonie: Block for July is in the newsletter...fabric colors are Red, White, and Blue. Winner of April Blocks is Candace Bark.

Shop Hop, Ruth McCormick: Everyone seemed to have a good time.

Pin Cushion, Glenda Carlsson: Pin cushion exchange was held near the front during break.

Bus Trips and Retreat: Arlene Sexton and Kayle McNett: Everyone had a great retreat. We had 39 participants, and from the feedback it was a great venue, great rooms, and delicious food. I think everyone agrees it would be a super place to go again. Montana Trip - The dates of our fall retreat are October 26-29, 2023. We will be at the Spruce Lodge, Lakeside, Mt. There are several neat quilt shops on the way to and from the lodge. We have plans to visit a few of these shops. Look at the website for registration information. The cost is \$600 for members and \$650 for non-members. The bus rental takes up a good portion of this amount. A detailed itinerary and other information will be in an upcoming Facebook post and in the newsletter. This event has been CANCELED.

Charity Central and Nominations, Kathleen Woods: We have given away 128 Quilts since the January meeting. We gave 25 to Cancer Center NW, 20 to Catholic Charities, 17 each to Volunteers of America, Sacred Heart Hospital, and Refugee Connection. We gave 15 quilts to the Salvation Army, and 2 each to Vanessa Behan, Ronald McDonald and Hospice. Thank you for all you do for the Spokane Community. We are introducing Charity Rolls, Charity Cakes, and Charity Charms today. We have taken our latest donation from Shabby Fabrics, cut it up and made these charity packs for you to take home and make your favorite jelly roll, layer cake, and charms patterns into a quilt top. Please sign them out when you take them and back in when you return the tops. Our supply of kits is getting low, thank you so much for that and we are hoping all the kits are gone by the end of the year. We have 3 cross stitch quilts that we will be having a silent auction on during the break. They are not suitable for a quilt top that will be washed a lot. Kim Mitchell took these and repaired, quilted, cleaned and rebound these cute quilts. Bid high and often. The winner will be announced before the speaker

begins. We are selling "one-pound Bundles" and various kits which helps Charity Central stay self-sustaining. Thank You. We have given away a good part of our fabric to many groups looking for it for their own charity work. We are now down to a much leaner and cleaner fabric stash. We are in the fabric business not the fabric storage business. Today I brought 25 quilts that needed binding and they are all gone. Thank you for those who do this binding for us. We have 320 members on our Facebook page. This is amazing as we have been only on Facebook less than a year. How is everyone doing on the strip challenge? The box is here for your completed blocks. We will combine some of the shabby fabrics and make more kits.

Nominations for 2024. We need nominees for President, Secretary and Quilt Show Chair. We have a volunteer for the Speakers and Workshops position, Glenda Carlsson. Diane Pantry has agreed to stay on as Treasurer. Each position is for a one-year term, with a maximum of two years.. If you are interested, please let me or the current officer know. They can give you more information on what the job entails. [We wonder who reads all the meeting minutes. If you have read completely through the minutes from the April meeting, see Ruth McCormick for a small gift at the July meeting!]




Harvest of Quilts Rosalia

Margie Karavitis Award

The Margie Karavitis Award was set up years ago to honor Margie Karavitis who did exquisite hand appliqué and hand quilting. Two of her quilts, "Cherry Rose" and "Oh My Stars" are in the National Quilting Museum in Paducah, KY. (https://quiltmuseum.org). Photos of both quilts may be found on the WSQ website, courtesy of the National Quilt Museum.

Since many of our members did not know Margie, the Quilt Show Committee decided to explain the significance of the Award and to establish guidelines to encourage entries into the hand quilted categories.

There is no special category for the Award. Instead, quilts must be entered into the appropriate hand quilted category and meet the following requirements:

- Quilts must be made entirely by one person.
- They must be hand quilted.
 - 1. Whole cloth quilts must be entirely hand quilted. Panels and stamped designs of any kind are not allowed.
 - 2. Wool quilts with hand appliqué and hand quilting are also acceptable.
 - 3. Sashiko by hand will also be considered.
- All appliqué must be done entirely by hand.
- Pieced quilts may be pieced by machine but must have large, open spaces to showcase the quilting. They must be entirely hand quilted.
- Quilts may be any size. Entries in the home dec category will **NOT** be considered.
- You may use a sewing machine to stitch hand appliquéd blocks together, attach sashings and borders, and attach binding to the top of the quilt. Binding must be finished by hand.

Judging will be done on Saturday afternoon.
