She specializes in animal themes with both pieced and appliqued blocks. Her quilts are unique, lively and happy with a subtle sense of humor. The animals she creates have personality over realism. They are adorable!! Karen will share two different lectures with us. The 1pm meeting lecture will be "Capturing Animal Personalities" and the 6pm lecture will be "The Smuggle Principals". Yes, you read that right, 2 different lectures on the same day!!

In the 1:00 lecture she'll talk about how to capture an animal's personality, how to make it look like your own or a much-loved pet, faster ways to add shading and dimension, how technology can assist us and much more.

The 6:00 lecture will be about the seven design elements which make a quilt "sing!"

- -S slight asymmetry
- -M movement
- -U unexpected technique
- -G gentle humor
- -G graceful disruption of edges/borders
- -L something lovable
- -E elegant details

WSQ Quilt Show October 18-20

Karen will be teaching a "**Moonlight Rhapsody**" workshop on Friday April 26, 2024.

Moonlight Rhapsody is a 21" x 24" applique wall hanging including a fox, raccoon, moon and owl all singing together in the night! Students may opt to fuse the appliques or use the needle turn method.

The workshop will cover:

- Expert tips for small pieces (including how to use fewer!)
- "Stuffed applique" (not trapunto)
- Finishing off-the-edge pieces
- Simple hand embellishment stitches
- Creating lifelike eyes
- Finishing and quilting



Karen will be teaching a "Fancy/Feathers/Frogs Table Toppers!" workshop on Saturday, April 27, 2024.

Students will choose between either the Fancy Feathers pattern or the In-Frog-nito pattern. The workshop will be using Karen's *Middle to Middle Piecing Method*. It's not paper piecing! Think piecing

a log cabin block but with shapes instead of strips.

The workshop will cover:

- Cutting pieces in multiples using templates
- Piecing the blocks by "matching middles" and trimming
- Creating applique feathers
- Using simple hand embellishment stitches
- Finishing and guilting





Workshops are held at the

'Bagging Party' Committee

If you've been to a WSQ meeting, you've probably heard a request for volunteers for the Quilt Show 'Bagging Party'. So what exactly is involved in the 'Bagging Party'? When exhibitors turn their quilts entered in the annual quilt show in to the 'drop-off' locations, there is a small ziploc bag for each quilt containing a receipt, a label for each quilt, a bag to put the quilt in at take-down and a safety pin. The 'Bagging Party' volunteers are the ones who place all these items in that ziploc. There are typically 500-600 quilts entered in the show and 12-15 drop-off locations. We work in teams of 3 or 4 seated at tables; last year we finished in less than 2 hours, so just a short morning project. It's a great opportunity to work with a friend or meet new WSQ members. This year's 'Bagging Party' will be held on Thursday, September 19th – the location has not yet been confirmed. WSQ will host the second Mystery Quilt project to begin in April 2024. We had such a great response and participation for last year's Wandering Grace, that we are off on another journey with Finding Grace. For those unfamiliar with mysteries ... a supply list of fabric needed is provided. Then, at various intervals, individual clues, as to how to cut and/or sew the pieces are released. No one knows what the quilt will look like until the end ... hence the mystery! Even though everyone is using the same pattern, the fabric choices create tops that are all unique.

Here's how the project will proceed...

- After the April 2024 General Membership Meeting supply list, cutting and clues 1 & 2.
- After the July 2024 General Membership Meeting Clues 3, 4 & 5
- After the September 2024 General Membership Meeting Clues 6, 7 & 8
- After the January 2025 General Membership Meeting Clues 9, 10 & 11

The quilt will be revealed at the April 2025 General Membership Meeting. After the meeting, the final clue will be sent. The goal is to complete your quilt and show it at the September Show and Tell. THEN to enter it into WSQ Quilt Show in October 2025.

We will have a private Facebook group for all who register. It will be the place to get inspiration, ask questions, and encourage each other. There will be one pin given for the initial entry of the mystery quilt into a WSQ show, with a year bar for the year the quilt was entered. Subsequent entities will receive a year bar to attach to the original pin.

It was brought to my attention that there may be members who do not know or understand what our Fair Ribbons Committee is all about. Our WSQ by-laws read, in part, that our purpose is "... to promote and enhance the art of quilt making by exhibitions, lectures, and workshops offered to the organization membership and the general public". Twenty years ago one of our members had the idea that one way to follow this mission statement, while also supporting local fairs in the Inland Northwest, would be to give each fair a first and second place ribbon to be awarded at their fair using criteria that we provide. In addition to the ribbon, the first place winner also receives a monetary award. Once we receive a picture of each winner, it is added to our WSQ website; right now you can see the winning quilts from 2021 through 2023 on the website. Over the years, we have received numerous thank-you notes from award winners who were pleased to receive the beautiful ribbons. By supporting the fairs, we are promoting quilt making and sharing the quilts with the general public. In addition to past winners, you can go to the WSQ website to find a link to the exhibitor guide/entry forms for each fair. Many of them have not yet been updated for 2024, so check back periodically.




Fig B Layout and cutting for a Bird block Sizes include seam allowances All pieces to be cut as squares or rectangles

- b 2½in x 7½in (6.4cm x 19cm)
- c 1½in (3.8cm) square
- d 4½in x 3½in (11.4cm x 9cm)
- e 4½in x 5½in (11.4cm x 14cm)
- f 3in (7.6cm) square
- g 2%in (6cm) square to make 2in half-square triangles (unfinished)
- h 2in (5.1cm) square
- 1 3½in (9cm) square
- 1 1¾in (4.4cm) square
- k 3½in x 4in (9cm x 10.2cm)
- I 4in x 3¾in (10.2cm x 9.5cm)
- m 4%in (11.1cm) square to make 4in half-square triangles (unfinished)
- n 4in x 1¾in (10.2cm x 4.4cm)
- o 13in x 21/2 in (33cm x 5.7cm)

Eye

Hand sew with a French knot using six strands of black stranded cotton

Block size

13in x 12in (33cm x 30.5cm) (unfinished)

2 The block uses units that have a triangle created on a corner, so we will show this technique first. Take a **b** rectangle and one **c** square. Pencil mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the small square and place the square right sides together with the top right corner of the rectangle, with the marked line angled as shown in **Fig C**. Pin if needed and then sew along the marked line and trim off excess fabric ¼in (6mm) outside the sewn lines. Press the triangle outwards.

42nd ANNUAL QUILT SHOW APRIL 13-14 IN MOSCOW

A family-friendly event is the **Palouse Patchers' Annual Quilt Show**, Saturday, April 13, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sunday, April 14, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Latah County Fairgrounds Event Center, 1021 Harold Street, in Moscow ID. This year's theme is "Come Fly With Me." Over 200 quilts are expected. The quilts are not for sale, but attendees can view quilts that won ribbons deemed best for various categories, like piecing, hand or machine quilting, applique, etc. Attendees are invited to vote for the People's Choice award.

Anyone can buy a chance to win a queen-sized raffle quilt. This year's quilt features well known flying geese quilt blocks in a dramatic diagonal setting with birds flying upwards across the quilt. The pleasing blue and brown colors have generated excitement from many eager to win. The winning ticket will be drawn at 4:00 pm on Sunday, April 14, but you do not need to be present to win.

The show has been an annual hit with families and community members since 1981 and is a showcase for experienced regional quilters as well as beginners and youth. Quilts of all sizes and styles, made by hand and machine, are hung throughout the event hall with vendor booths around the edges. Ten stores will be selling fabric, notions, patterns, tools and give free advice.

Free cookies and refreshments will be in the kitchen. The fee to enter is \$5.00 for the day, or \$3.00 for seniors and children under 10. Groups can request a discount by contacting Debbie Goetz at grammygoetz@frontier.com.

One quilter will be awarded a monetary prize from the Janet Frietag Fund if they enter works that follow the theme of "This Challenge is for the Birds!" "The world is full of birds of all shapes and sizes, goofy and realistic, so we expect some creative entries," said Nancy Mack, Quilt Show promotions chair. Guild members may also vie for the Quilt Show's Co-chair's Challenge called "Take Flight" that could feature any form of flight.

JANUARY 25, 2024
