Art from the Heart 46th Annual WSQ Quilt Show

The past year has gone by quickly, and we are only a month away from the show. Thanks to all the hard work and dedication of the Quilt Show Committee, we are going to be ready when the show opens on October 18th. I want to thank everyone for the wonderful work you've done!

A few days before the deadline only about 360 quilts had been entered so the deadline was extended by a day. End result? About 650 quilts. Yikes! I've talked to some quilters who said they'd hurried to enter quilts they hadn't yet begun because the number of entries was so low. Many thanks to all of you who did that, but if you still haven't made the quilts, please consider withdrawing them and entering them into next year's show. Jane Bitz and Heidi Libby are working on the layout, and while they can find spaces for all those quilts, the show will be crowded. PLEASE, if you decide to withdraw an entry for any reason, let Kristin know as soon as possible.

With so many quilts, it's more important than ever that we have at least 80 to 100 volunteers to help with set-up. In addition to set-up, we also need volunteers to help with ballot counting, the Boutique, demos, hostessing, raffle ticket sales, stash check and about 40-50 volunteers for take down. In total we need about 300 volunteers to make the show run smoothly.

There is another volunteer opportunity/need that hasn't been mentioned before: our transportation team. Nan and Dave go to the storage locker to load a truck and haul everything to the quilt show for set-up on Thursday and then load everything back up and return to the storage locker after the show. They need two volunteers to help them on Thursday, 10/17, to pick up storage items and then again on 10/20 to put things back. Can you help on one or both days?

Don't forget that those who volunteer for at least four hours will have free admission for all three days and volunteers need not be members. Whether you need to sit down or like to stay on the move, we have something for everyone to do.

Don't forget to purchase your 2024 quilt show pin and t-shirt!

Many thanks to everyone who works on the committee and volunteers at the show! The WSQ show wouldn't exist without ALL of you.

WSQ welcomes Barbara Blanton to our Sept 26, 2024, guild membership meeting. Barbara is joining us from Williamsburg VA, where she started the Academy of Applique – a week-long applique retreat/school held annually at Kingsmill Resort in Williamsburg, VA, offering (2) three-day sessions of 10 teachers each from around the world to about 250 students.

Barbara is passionate about appliquè and guarantees that with her patience and humor, students will love this handwork art form by the end of class. She reminds us that every journey starts with a single step. No matter where



you are in your applique journey – from barely knowing how to spell the word to an experienced appliquer – come and let her share her experience with you. Check Barbara out at https://www.academyofapplique.com/meetthefounder/

At our September 26, 1:00 pm and 6:00 pm general membership meetings, Barbara will entertain us with her trunk show called "Better Done Than Perfect" – full of humor, plenty of quilts and time saving tips which allow her to finish 3-5 Applique tops per year. Join us at Center Place in Spokane Valley for both meetings. NO ZOOM Host volunteer, Zoom meeting unavailable. Please plan to attend in-person.

Barbara will be teaching workshops on both Friday, Sept. 27 and Saturday, Sept. 28. Each workshop will give the students a choice of 2 block patterns to work from. The blocks are perfect for a beginner or a more experienced appliquer who would like to learn new methods. By the end of class you will LOVE applique, Guaranteed!

Day 1 will focus on templates, overlays, circles, curves, points and needle turn applique. Day 2 will repeat techniques from Day 1 and focus on circles, circles, circles; smaller pieces and a Celtic motif of stems. Both classes are appropriate for ALL levels of stitchers and will set you up for success in ANY other project you might want to tackle.

There will be a mandatory kit fee of \$25 for each workshop, payable to Barbara at the beginning of the workshop. The kit will include the student's pre-selected pattern, fabric and everything needed to complete the block. Students just need to bring their smiles. Workshops will be held at the Hampton Inn (2010 S Assembly RD, Spokane WA 99224) from 9am – 4pm (doors open at 8:30). << Bring your lunch and join us for the workshops>>> Friday's workshop is currently full. 
QUILT SHOW BAGGING PARTY

She said we need a 2025 Quilt Show Chairperson, a Zoom Host, and a Publicity Co-chair, a Quilting Bee Chairperson, and a Historian Co-chair. The deadline for entering your quilts into the quilt show is August 4, 2024. We have a Friendship Swap; see Twila Prociv for info. See MaryAnn Naylor for the Challenge Quilt called "Back to Basics". Minutes from the April 24, 2024, General Membership Meeting were approved as presented. Our volunteer of the quarter is Lorean Boornazian; she was presented with a pin, a certificate, and a free class certificate. Lorean stepped in to be this year's Quilt Show Chair.

Executive Board Reports: 1st Vice President Glenda Carlsson reported that for Toby Lischko's classes on Friday and Saturday kits have not arrived. Due to low staffing, the Hampton Inn will not be serving lunch. All class participants will be responsible for their own lunch. Friday's class has sold out, but there may be 1 or 2 openings for Saturday's class. Glenda reviewed the list of speakers and classes through July 2025.

2nd Vice President Lorean Boornazian thanked Heidi Libby and Jane Bitz for taking charge of Quilt Show set up. They will need 80 to 100 volunteers to spend up to 4 hrs. for the set-up. Someone to be in charge of Take Down is needed. Volunteers are needed in all areas. Sign up sheets are on the back tables. Volunteers don't have to be members, and if you volunteer for 4 hours you get in for free. The deadline for entering your quilts is August 4. All items entered into the show must be made of cloth, they cannot be framed, on stretcher bars, or under glass. All items must be able to be pinned to a sheet or a sleeve. Items in Home/Decor/Wearable Art will be placed on a table or hung on a garment hangar.

Treasurer Cathy Anderson reported that the accounts are in order. She asked that if you received a check from WSQ to please cash it, and for committee chairs to check their budgets and to turn in any vouchers.

Committee Reports:

Kristin Echols reported that there are about 200 quilts registered. The goal is 500. All registered quilters will get a confirmation email stating that the entry has been received. She is looking for a volunteer to host evening Zoom meetings. A job description is on the back table. Kristin will not be able to do them anymore due to a previous engagement. Paula Ferry, Nominations, Thanked the current officers who were all "newbies" to the board. She reported that the slate of Officers for 2025 is selected if no new nominations are presented in the evening meeting. The slate will be presented at the September meeting for voting. The positions have a term limit of 2 years.

With the new grant money we received, from the City of Spokane Valley, we will be adding some classes to our Quilt Show. The class presenters will be Heather Black, Cheryl Clossin, Charisma Horton and Robin Long, Janet Nesbitt, and Susan Smith. Check the website for class

descriptions, dates, times, and costs. The Quilting Bee will be loaning the machines for the classes. If you like the machine you may purchase it from the Quilting Bee.

Historian Ruth Danner needs some help with the scrapbooking and picture taking. If you are interested contact her.

Darlene Mossman reported that you may still sign up for the Mystery Quilt for 2025 show. There were many members who did not finish their quilts of Finding Grace for the 2023 quilt show. You may enter them into the show this year. She has received the WSQ Mystery Quilt Pin for those who entered them in the 2023 show. Darlene is looking for volunteers during the Quilt Show classes to assist the teachers.

The Raffle Quilt committee, Colleen and Cheryl, reported that they have participated in 10 events and have 2 more scheduled before the quilt show, and they will be at the membership meeting and at the Show. Volunteering to sell tickets is a sit down job. Sign up thru the Hostess Committee. If you know of events, please let either of them know. Their next 2 scheduled days for selling raffle tickets are Saturday, August 24 at the Millwood Days and Saturday, September 21 at the Cheney High Community Day.
