"My interest in making art quilts was jump-started by see-

ing my dear friend Sara take a variety of patterned fabrics, cut them into pieces and combine them in such an artistic way. As a life-long sewer (having experienced my first sewing triumph with a skating skirt I made in Girl Scouts), I took to quilting quickly. One of the great thrills with this art form is that my options are as infinite as those of a painter working on canvas -- landscapes, portraits, geometric patterns, abstract impressions, etc. I enjoy both the deep American roots of traditional quilting and the unlimited possibilities today's art quilts present. Combining elements of both extremes is great fun, as I often use contemporary fabrics in centuryold quilt patterns.

My art quilts have been on display in multiple art shows and quilt shows as well as in national quilt magazines ("Quilters Newsletter" magazine and "Quiltmaker") over 20 times and in three books (including Ricky Tims' "Kool Kaleidoscopes").

April Showers Bring May Flowers

(This is basically four snowball blocks sewn together to make a flower)




Materials:

- Twelve 1½" corner squares
 Four 2" corner squares
- (Whites) (Yellows)
 - Four 5" squares for the center (
- (Yellows) (Spring/flower colors)

Assembling the block

- 1. Start by marking a diagonal line on each of the 1½" and 2" corner squares (alternatively, you can eyeball it or fold diagonally and press them)
- 2. Make four: For each 5" square: arrange 3 white and one yellow corner squares to align with the corners, right sides together. Sew the corners to the larger square following the line you marked. Repeat for all four squares.
- 3. Trim ¼" past the sewn line, cutting off the corners of the square. Discard trimmed pieces.
- 4. Press all four corners open, pressing the seams toward the darker fabric.
- 5. Piece the four blocks together, with yellow squares in the center, to finish the block.



Bringing back an old tradition Whoever wins blocks at the April meeting: if you use the blocks to make a charity quilt and bring the completed quilt to the July meeting you will receive a small surprise gift. This will also count as an entry for the 20 in 2020 challenge.

Charity Central April 2022

We delivered 117 quilts this month to the Spokane Community. We collected about 100 quilts at the January meeting and then added a few more. We donated 55 quilts to the Refugee Connection, 25 to Cancer Care, 20 to Hospice for their "at home" program, 15 to the Vanessa Behan Crisis Nursery, and 2 extra large ones to Catholic Charities for their new housing units. There are about 20 small children's quilts left and we have collected about 10 more. These are the seeds for the next batch. Thank you so much to all who donated.

Our Chair JoAnn Sandstrom has decided to step down. We wish to thank JoAnn for all she has done for Charity Central. She will be missed. Jo-Ann has put her house on the market and so we had to move all the fabric that was stored there. Sheryl Anderson has agreed to become the new Chair and has taken it all to store at her house. Thank you to Sheryl and crew for all the work of moving literally a ton of fabric. We are working on re organizing the fabric and now that we have had to touch every piece in the collection, we have decided that we have too much. We need to do something different. If you or your charitable group needs fabric, please contact Charity Central and we will be happy to accommodate you as best we can. We have given fabric to a group that is making quilts for policemen and firemen injured in the line of duty and to another group making quilts for a crisis nursery. We have given fabric to Quilts of Valor and to a group making Christmas stockings for foster kids. The amount of fabric we have is overwhelming and it needs to be used, not stored.

In the last four years we have gotten rid of our back log of over 200 unquilted tops by making quilt bundles and getting them out to be quilted. The quilts are slowly being returned. It's hard to find time to quilt for charity when there is so much else going on in life. If you picked up a quilt bundle over a year ago and have not had a chance to quilt it, you can return it. We appreciate your willingness to try even if you could not quite accomplish it. We now have a back log of quilt kits. We introduced the kits about six months before the shutdown. We have over 400 kits available. These are all precut scrappy and include a pattern, backing, and binding. These were made from our smallest scraps, and we have a lot of small scraps! We will continue bringing our kits to the membership meetings. Drop off your completed top and

pick up a kit for another!

We are putting out Facebook posts frequently, usually on Sunday, to keep you up to date with Charity Central. We post pictures of quilts that were donated and ideas on how to use your stash to make Charity Quilts. It seemed like the members donated quilts and then never heard about them again. We are showing some of the great quilts we get and tell you where they are going. We have several bins of UFO projects and orphan blocks so we will be giving you some ideas on how to use your own UFOs and clear out your old stash. It is a lot of fun to take something old and make something new to pass on to those in need.

We will be doing more fund-raising with our fabric. We will continue with our "Charity Chunks" but are looking at adding precut strips and squares in one color and mystery scrap bags with our smallest scraps. Our budget with WSQ is not enough to pay for the batting we need to keep up with our average of 400 quilts a year. Our Fundraising covers our batting purchases. Stop by Charity Central to see how things are going. You can do a little stash enhancement and charity work at the same time. See you in April!

Toby Lischko is scheduled for July 2024. We will see if there is interest for an EQ8 class for her to teach. She will also teach a mini quilt class.

There are two more Global Quilt Connection Virtual Sampler Platters scheduled for 2022 on July 30th and 31st, and September 17th & 18th from noon to 3pm Pacific Time. These are free to guild members as a perk for membership. More information will be coming, so check out the WSQ website for details.

We are looking into offering short classes and demos in the months that we do not have our general membership meetings, taught by our very own talented members. Some of these could be in person and some virtual. Kristin will be creating a survey to see if there is an interest in future classes/program options.

Kristin and I are coordinating the Mug Rug swap for 2022. This will be a seasonal mug rug swap. The partners have been notified. We had 24 people sign up for the April swap. We will collect signups for the next round at the April meeting for the summer season mug rug swap that will be due in July. It is a fun way to meet other members!

Kristin will survey our members to find out the interest for doing a mystery quilt. I will bring it to the guild at the April meeting and have the first clues ready to hand out at the July meeting. Starting in July, we would give the clues for Aug and Sept. Then the clues at the Sept meeting would go from Oct – Jan (4 clues), the Jan meeting would give out clues for Feb/Mar/April, and then the April clues would be for May/ June/July 2023. The final projects to be presented at Sew and Tell at the September 2023 meeting. Cost for the mystery will be \$15 per person.

WSQ General Membership Evening Meeting Minutes


