After years of working in her basement, Amy has been blessed to transform a little stone house in the country into her sewing studio. Her absolute favorite thing is to see photos of the quilts you make from her designs. Hearing from quilters about the fun they have working on the patterns and the smiles on their faces when they see their finished quilts makes it a truly rewarding job.

Hello fellow quilters. The 2022 Quilt Show is shaping up to be an "Extravaganza". As we continue preparations for the show we need your help. It takes over 300 volunteers to put on a quilt show of this size. The quilt show committee chairs will be available to answer questions, give updates, & sign you up to volunteer. A wonderful perk of volunteering 4 hours or more is FREE admission to the quilt show all three days.

Have you purchased your quilt show pin yet? You'll find yours at the Fundraising table. The cost is \$5.00 and it's a great way to support WSQ.

We've had a few hiccups with on-line quilt registration, but Kristin has been working with Zipline Web Designer to get the issue resolved. There are two ways to register your quilt: either register online or download a registration form and mail it in. The maximum number of quilts you can enter is 5 per person. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me by text, phone, or email. The deadline for quilt registration is August 7<sup>th</sup>. We've had many questions about having your quilt professionally judged. If you have your quilt judged, rest assured it is still eligible to win a ribbon in the show. The cost is \$10.00.

I've also served on numerous Quilt Show committees. I began my quilting journey in 1995 and enjoy traditional piecing, applique, modern quilting, fabric dyeing, and longarm quilting. I enjoy taking workshops through WSQ where I always learn new tips and techniques! I've found WSQ to be a wonderful organization and have made many friends throughout my years of membership."

**Darlene Mossman- 1<sup>st</sup> VP Speakers/Workshops**. Darlene is our current 1<sup>st</sup> VP. She says "I was introduced to quilting in 2005 and have been addicted since then. I was 1<sup>st</sup> VP of programs for 6 nonconsecutive years at my previous guild in CA, the membership VP for one year, and president of that guild for 2 years. I believe that it is vital to volunteer and contribute to our community and to promote our art form. I have very much enjoyed booking and hosting the WSQ speaker/teachers, who have visited our guild, both virtually and in person for 2021 and 2022, and look forward to our events in 2023. I am also the group leader for Welcome Home Quilts of Valor in Newport, WA. **Patty Yedinak- 2<sup>nd</sup> VP Quilt Show**. Patty is our current Quilt Show Chair. She says "I previously served as Quilt Show Chair in 2013 and 2014; WSQ President in 2016 and 2017; and various other board positions since joining WSQ many years ago. I retired as a Lt. Col. from the US Air Force in 2006 and officially retired as a Registered Nurse in 2014. I am an active volunteer with the American Red Cross and Medical Reserve Corp. In my spare time I love to quilt, piece, and stitch."

**Diane Pantry- Treasurer.** Diane says "Even though I have sewn since I was a kid, it wasn't until about 5 years ago, when I needed a new sewing machine and purchased one that was designed for a quilter, that I caught the quilting bug. I joined WSQ soon after to meet other quilters and learn more skills. I wanted to volunteer in some capacity to be more involved. When I heard that the guild needed a new Treasurer, I knew I had found my calling. For the last 40 years I have worked as a bookkeeper and office manager at several small businesses. If all goes as planned, I will be retired from my current job before my term begins, which will give me plenty of time to devote to the Treasurer tasks (and do more quilting!). I am looking forward to serving on the board and getting to know more members."

Shirley Shirkey- Secretary. Shirley has been appointed as our current Secretary since the position was vacant. Shirley says "I am a mother of 5, I have 14 grandchildren, and too many great grandchildren to count. I started sewing clothing and, after the children departed, I began quilting to fill my spare time. I got hooked early and am now a fabric hoarder. I have been quilting about 30 years. While I was still working, I bought my longarm and too many machines. I was a member of WSQ in 2015-2016. During Covid, I wanted to be more involved. The Board sort of scares me, but I decided to go for it anyway. Quilting is my love. It outweighs the books I used to read, the meals I used to cook. It keeps me out of the bars. It isn't a cheap hobby, but I pour love into each quilt. My family has all the quilts they will ever want, and I give a lot to charity at my church. My closet still bulges!"

Thank you to each one of these ladies for their willingness to serve. At the July meeting, I will introduce them all to you. At the September meeting, I will ask for nominations from the floor, and then we will vote to install our 2023 Executive Board.

# **Charity Central**

The big news from Charity Central is our very own private Facebook page! We have about 150 members and are growing every week. Everyone is welcome to join us and to post pictures and updates of Charity Projects they are working on. To join us, go to the WSQ Facebook page, click on the Groups tab, and ask to join Charity Central. We want to be sure that you are a real person to keep everyone safe. Once you have

joined, invite all your quilting friends to join. We are posting almost every week with things found in the Charity Central UFO bin and pictures of quilts that have been donated. There are tips for using up your own stuff, too.

At the April meeting, we collected 80 completed quilts and 18 tops. Thank you so much to all who contributed. We gave 10 quilts to the Ronald McDonald House, mostly smaller ones for the premature babies whose parents are using the facilities. 15 went to the Women's Drop In Center/Transitions who help young women start a new life. Volunteers of America got 22 for three of their programs, Independent Youth Housing Program, Alexandria's House, and Aston Black Apartments. There is another article in the newsletter talking about those programs. 21 went to Sacred Heart Hospital. We have a few leftover for whatever may come up before our next meeting. You do more good than



you know with your generous donations to the Spokane Community.

The Charity Central Committee has grown as well. We have a core group of about 10 that are helping us get a handle on our fabric stash. At the April meeting we introduced our "Mystery Scrap Bags" and our



"One Pound Bundles". The scrap bags feature one pound of our smallest scraps in one color way and our bundles are coordinated larger pieces, adding up to a pound. They both were well received. The committee will continue sorting and folding our fabric to make it more accessible. We will be looking at introducing other fund-raising items such as strip bundles or precut squares as time goes on.

Charity Central attempts to be self-sustaining, meaning that we try to fund raise as much money as we are budgeted. Your purchase of our scrap bags and bundles helps us purchase more batting to get more quilts out into the community.

Our mission has changed over the last several years. We used to be able to offer small grants for charitable projects by others. Now we need help to complete our own larger mission, covering those in need in Spokane in quilts. Thank you for all your help.

If you or your small group needs fabric for your charitable work, we would be glad to help. If you would like to pick up kits or drop off quilts or tops, we would love to hear from you. Charity Central- Sheryl Anderson, Kathleen Woods, Annie Sanders

Do you wonder where the quilt that you donated ends up? Most go to non profit organizations, many of which assist people in need of housing. In this and future issues I shall try to show-case many of the organizations that receive our quilts. The following article has been submitted by the Volunteers of America.

Annie Sanders, Charity Central committee member

Thank you again for all the quilts, they are all so beautiful!

The quilts went to three of our programs.

Independent Youth Housing Program houses young people 18-23 years of age. We have 8 apartments around the Spokane area to house young people who age out of foster care in Washington state. Services include rent subsidy, case management, and independent living classes. Young people have the ability to take over their lease as well as they will gain rental history.

Alexandria's House is a loving home where young women (ages 16-20) get the support and guidance they need to take the first steps to becoming powerful mothers. With the help of our compassionate staff, young mothers learn to create a warm and loving home atmosphere and provide proper care for their babies. Alexandria's House can welcome up to five mothers and their babies at a time into a charming historic home in Browne's Addition. Built in 1901 and recently updated, the building has seven furnished bedrooms and five and a half bathrooms, as well as a spacious kitchen and dining area, shared living and laundry rooms, space for meetings and classes and a beautiful yard for little feet to explore. Infants get a healthy start with prenatal and well-baby care. Moms get vital parenting training, gather essential skills for living successfully on their own and are empowered to continue their progress in treatment, education and employment. Public health nurses, Circle of Security parenting specialists and other community partners help us provide the emotional, psychological and physical support systems that our moms and babies need. We strive to end generational cycles of poverty, child abuse and neglect.

Aston-Bleck Apartments are a transitional housing program for girls graduating from Alexandria's House. Each young woman receives comprehensive case management during and after her stay at the apartments. The goal of the program is to provide young women with a safe place to practice

independent living skills with the help of compassionate staff.

The program is designed to help young women who are interested in securing a healthy and stable future prepare to live successfully on their own by empowering them with new skills in the support of a community that includes: access to prenatal and early childhood care, employment readiness training, medical, mental health and treatment referrals. Aston-Bleck apartments residents are encouraged to: attend work and/or school, participate in weekly parenting training and/or independent living classes, pay 30% of their income toward rent and utilities when income is available, remain drug and alcohol free, and work toward individual goals with a case manager We help them get set up on their own and continue to support them as they build their new lives.


