Join one of the world's most enthusiastic personalities for ooo's, aaaah's, and laughter to learn a plethora of tips to increase accuracy and add fresh, interesting details with piping, prairie points, heavy threads, and embellishments. See how to take show pieces to new levels and add charming surprises to simple pieces. Susan will share real live quilts with close ups through the projector so you're sure to see oodles of detail. You may recognize many quilts as winners in AQS Paducah shows and International Quilt Festivals in Houston! Don't miss out on this good time!

Susan's enthusiasm for quilting is said to be contagious! In classes, she works toward keeping an upbeat setting, providing well-written instructions, and attending to each student with personalized coaching. Her quilts have received many awards in international competitions since 1997 where judges comment on fine workmanship and original style. With unique designs, she is thrilled to include charming, unexpected elements such as specialty threads, prairie points, piping, and great binding techniques. In 2010 she was delighted to be named Minnesota Quilter of the Year!

Susan will teach her workshop "Piping Hot Binding" on Friday September 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Piped bindings add spark and a professional finish to any style piece. Every detail of binding and tiny perfect piping will be covered in class with step-by-step demos and printed instructions. Machine differences will be addressed so students will be successful with their own machines. Students work on their practice piece to achieve making perfect piping, preparing the quilt, applying piping, applying binding, mitering corners, joining tails, and finishing for a show-quality back. Variations will be on display and discussed. Many major award-winners are using this technique to achieve stunning results!



The topic of the September 24<sup>th</sup> workshop is Ringie Dingie



Double points put a contemporary spin on this long-time favorite. They also eliminate the need for the traditional appliqued circle in the center of each circle and allow rings to interlock! These Dresdens are built on a foundation so background fabrics don't show through and, more importantly, Dresdens turn out perfectly flat. Learn Susan's tips for speedily turning wedge points with the Prairie Pointer Tool. At home you may finish the quilt by quilting the background then ditch stitching Dresdens onto the quilted quilt! Design possibilities are endless!

# WHY YOUR DUES MATTER AND WHY WSQ VOTED TO INCREASE DUES FOR 2023

I was asked to write an article for the newsletter to address our nearly unanimous vote in July to increase our membership dues to \$35 with an emailed newsletter or \$50 for dues plus a printed newsletter.

For the board presentation we provided an extensive review of the dues other guilds in Washington State pays and compared this to what those guilds offer what WSQ offers. In addition we compared our actual expenses vs income for the past several years.

This analysis showed that for the 18 guilds included in the comparison, WSQ paid the 2<sup>nd</sup> to lowest dues with \$20 being the lowest. Most of the guilds paid an average of \$45-\$35 with a high of \$50 and a low of \$20. Our guild is one of the largest guilds in Washington State and we offer more events to our members than most of the guilds for our very low dues.

WSQ has not increased dues since 2006 as far as we are able to determine. This is 16 years of no increases to dues. Meanwhile, all costs have gone up. It costs more to fly so our speakers' costs have increased, yet we have not raised our prices for our workshops by National speakers. Our rental fees for Center Place, yard sale, quilting bees and the hotels for our speakers have all gone up.

When the budget committee meets each year to discuss the upcoming budget, we look at ways to cut costs while not increasing dues or workshop fees or the quilt show fees, and it has been increasingly difficult to do this without losing some of the sponsored events WSQ provides for our members.

We have two budgets each year, one for the General budget which includes all non-quilt show related income and expenses and the quilt show budget which is strictly for the quilt show. Our membership dues and other fundraising events in the general budget cover the fixed costs (costs we have to pay no matter what) and sponsored events which include quilting bees, newsletters, speakers, and fair ribbons. For all of the years I have been finance chair and prepared the budget, the General budget's expenses are always more than income. The quilt show is our major fundraising event and the profit from the show covers this shortfall with anything over that going into a savings account to purchase larger items needed for the show or for example, our new website.

Since the pandemic, our membership decreased significantly in 2021 and is slightly better in 2022. After analyzing all of the above factors, the board had to make the hard decision to increase the dues in order to keep the guild running and to continue to provide all of the sponsored and fundraising events that make our guild so wonderful.

The newsletter costs a lot to print and mail which is why we also voted to add a fee for a printed newsletter to paid when your dues is renewed.

We thank all of those who have joined WSQ or renewed their dues for 2022 and look forward to seeing you at our meetings, small groups, bus trips, quilting bees, yard sale and of course our wonderful quilt show!

# Pumpkin Quilt Block

WSQ Spokane Block Exchange – September 2022

FABRICS:

Block size: 81/2" unfinished


Pumpkin:


(oranges, brown, green)


- ☑ Six orange fabric strips, cut into 1½" x 5½" strips
- ☑ Brown fabric, cut into a 1½" square
- ☑ Green fabric, cut into a 1½" x 3" strip

Background fabric (Off-white, cream, natural muslin)


- ☑ Two strips, cut 1½" x 8½"
- ☑ Two strips, cut 1½" x 6½"
- ☑ One strip, cut 1½" x 3"
- ☑ Six squares, cut 1½"
- 1. Sew the Pumpkin Strips together lengthwise, press to one side
- Mark and Sew the Corners: Place a background square on each corner of the strips right side down, mark each square with a diagonal line from corner to corner. Sew on these lines. Trim the corners ¼" from the sewn line. Press the corners away from the orange strips.
- 3. Make the Leaf. Place the remaining two background squares on top of the green strip. Mark these from corner to corner as well, then sew on the lines. Trim away the corners ¼" from the sewn lines. Press the corners away from the green strip.
- 4. Sew the Stem row: 1 ½" background strip, brown square, leaf block. Press towards brown.
- 5. Sew stem to pumpkin. Press away from orange.
- 6. Sew borders: Sew the 1½" x 6½" background strips on either side of the pumpkin block. Press outwards. Then sew 1½" x 8½" background strips to the top and bottom of the pumpkin block. Press Outwards.

The way a Silent Auction works is that you write down your bid, keep checking to see if anyone has out bid you, and the highest bidder gets the item. Good luck to all!

We received a very large fabric donation from Shabby Fabrics. We have gotten it sorted by color and fabric line. There is so much beautiful fabric in this donation that it will take us months to get it made into kits, sorted into One Pound Bundles, and distributed to anyone who needs fabric for Charity Pro-

jects. A huge Thank You to Shabby Fabrics for their generous donation! We are not taking other fabric donations at this time. We are bursting at the seams and cannot store anymore. Once we get a handle on what we have, we hope to take donations again.

We are at 190 members on our Charity Central Facebook page. This is a private page that you must apply to. It's very easy to do and we do it to keep everyone a little safer. # WSQ QUARTERLY GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES July 28,2022

The minutes from the April 28 membership meeting were approved as published following both afternoon and evening meetings.

Cheryl Moriarty was announced as our volunteer of the quarter. She received a heart and hand pin, a certificate of thanks, and a workshop gift certificate. Paula presented a power point presentation regarding the financial state of WSQ. Our current dues of \$25 have been in place since at least 2006. A proposal to increase dues to \$35 in 2023 was unanimously passed at the June 8 Board meeting and was then presented at both afternoon and evening July membership meetings to change our standing rules. 
