

#### Notes to 2023 Budget

On November 30, 2022, my budget committee consisting of Paula Ferry, Vicki Trudel, Diane Pantry (incoming Treasurer), Darlene Mossman, and Patty Yedinak, met via Zoom to prepare the 2023 WSQ budget.

The process of preparing the budget consists of the committee carefully comparing the current year's budget with the actual income and expenditures and then we review the 2023 budget requests provided by the various committees for both the General and Quilt Show budgets relative to that comparison as well as the needs of the guild. Then the budget is prepared for the presentation to the board for approval.

The 2023 WSQ Budget was presented to the board on December 7, 2022 and after discussion, both budgets were unanimously passed.

Listed below are comments, changes or additions related to the 2023 budget:

- **General Budget –** Due to a combined net loss for 2021 and 2022 of \$17,333, the board voted to increase membership dues from \$25 to \$35 annually.
- **Bus Trips** Arlene Sexton and Kayla McNett have taken over bus trips and has two very exciting trips coming up. We budgeted a large amount for these two trips accordingly.
- **Membership** Due to increases in almost every venue used by WSQ we had to either limit how many events would occur or eliminate them. Without new and/or renewing members, even with the increase in dues, we estimate that the quilt show will need to have a minimum profit of \$4,000 to cover the shortfall. It is important that we continue to rebuild our membership.
- Mystery Quilt In 2022, Darlene Mossman started a mystery quilt which included a pattern and instructions each month. This has been popular and required some funding mid-year. She is continuing it through the end of the challenge so the budget was funded for another few months in case anyone wanted to sign up and catch up to where they currently are.
- Newsletter Ad Income In the past we used to fund this income category up to the IRS limit of \$1,000. And we would have a waiting list for advertising. Unfortunately, in the past few years, fewer and fewer people have paid to advertise in our newsletter. The cost is very inexpensive, and if you are interested, you can contact our current Newsletter Chair, Annie Sanders to have an ad for your business in the Newsletter. You will see we only estimated \$200.00 in income due to waning interest.
- Quilting Bee This is one of the sponsored events where the venue almost doubled the cost for 2023. It is also one of those sponsored events that has had waning interest. Kelly is looking at finding a less expensive venue, so the committee funded quilting bees for 2 Bees for 2023.

- Yard Sale In 2022, the yard sale committee was forced to find another venue and the only one available on short notice was the fairgrounds. This is a very popular event, however the fairgrounds also increased the cost of the venue substantially. So Kelly is going to work on finding another more affordable venue so the cost of renting a table is not passed onto our members. We funded this budget and more details will follow.
- **Miscellaneous** there were many committees that had a budgeted line item but over the years, were never used so those were eliminated.
- Other We always include a budgeted line item in both the General and Quilt show budgets which is 'Other'. This is the amount of expected profit we need from the Quilt Show to fund the shortfall in the General Budget. This estimated amount for 2023 is \$3,838. We are hopeful that our actual income estimates will be higher so that we can recover from the last 2 years of losses and add to our savings account for large expenditures needed for the Quilt Show.
- Quilt Show Our committee again addressed the increase of costs across the board. The quilt show is WSQ's primary fundraising event which supports the general budget and also, it is our primary fundraising event that supports our mission statement. Due to these increases, it was decided to increase the entry fee from \$10 for all 3 days to \$15. The cost for the fairgrounds is expected to increase between 10-12% so we budgeted for this accordingly.
- In Memorial Last year the grain silo was used to house this new exhibition which was set up to honor our WSQ members who had passed away in 2022. This was a very popular exhibition and due to this, the committee decided to fund it for 2023's show.
- Storage Unit WSQ currently has a large temperature-controlled storage unit to house mostly quilt show items but also, our financial records and other WSQ items. Charity Central had many boxes of fabric that had to be moved from a committee chair's home and so a temporary arrangement of a storage unit was granted and funded in 2022. In 2023, we will be looking for a larger combined unit which will house all WSQ owned items for safety and so no committee chair has to have these items in their home.

**Capital Account –** The Capital Account is a savings account funded by excess profits from the Quilt Show, not used to balance the General Budget. This account was set up to cover one-of-a kind expenses for both budgets. We have a very small amount left in that account due to no show in 2020 and the shortfalls in 2021 and 2022. We are very hopeful that we will have excess profits in 2023 to both fund this savings account and also rebuild the losses to our reserves. There are items needed for the quilt show of approximately \$1,500 which would come out of this account.

I have often heard many questions regarding our CD's held in reserve as well as other financial issues, especially as it relates to increases in dues and other costs. I am addressing these below, so our guild has a better understanding of these issues.

**Do we have to spend down our profit and/or reserves because we are a non-profit?** The answer to this is NO! We are a 501(c)(4) which is designated as a non-profit social club by the IRS. We are required to adhere to our mission statement and to timely file a non-profit tax return each year to maintain our non-profit status. We do NOT have to spend down reserves or profits.

Why do we not spend the money in our CD's? As you can see in this budget, our profits from the quilt show are sent over to support the shortfall in our general budget. In 2022 WSQ had an estimated shortfall in the general budget of \$-8,143 and an estimated profit in the quilt show budget of \$2,065 which means that we were required to use approximately \$6,000 of our reserves to cover expenses. This also means that there were no excess amounts to fund our capital savings account which covers large expenditures that are needed for the quilt show or other events. This is following our actual net loss in 2021 of \$11,256 which also came out of reserves. Because we had reserves, we were able to pay all expenditures with our dues and other fundraising profits as well as cash in the bank and did not have to use our CD's. However, if we were to continue on this trajectory of losses with no changes (dues increases, increases to quilt show entry fees, eliminating those events that cost money but have little or no interest), WSQ would use up the reserves in a little over 5 years.

It is important that all members utilize our fundraising events as the profits from them help support our general budget. Our primary fundraising events that fulfil our mission statement are the quilt show and workshops. The other fundraising events that also support our general budget are, bus trips, raffle ticket sales, fundraising, workshops, yard sale, and purchasing charity central kits.

I encourage you to continue to support our wonderful guild by renewing your membership and volunteering. The board has added several new sponsored events like the mystery quilt and mug rug exchange and we are looking at other events as well in 2023.

I would like to thank my committee for the help and insight they provide in the preparation of this budget as well as our board for the hard work they do throughout the year to support the guild.

# **Charity Central**

Happy New Year one and all! 2022 was a very good year for Charity Central and we plan to make 2023 even better! We have lots of plans and projects that only need your participation to make them successful.

In 2022 we gave away 300 quilts to 16 organizations. We have provided a raffle quilt to the Inland Northwest Machine Quilters as a thank you for all the quilting they do for us. We provided quilt flimsies to INMQ for their Panel Quilting Challenge. We sold "Mystery Scrap Bags" and "One Pound Bundles" at membership meetings. We held a "silent auction" on some vintage quilts. Charity Central has a budget given to us by WSQ but we are "self-sustaining", so we try to raise as much money as we are budgeted. Thank you for helping us do that! We packed and moved all our fabric twice. We got a huge donation from Shabby Fabrics and are looking forward to using it in new quilt kits. We started showing our quilts at Show and Tell and asking members to do the binding. We have given out hundreds of quilts in need of quilting and gotten many of them back. We have had lots of quilt kits picked up, pieced, and brought back again. We have started working with Block Exchange on getting completed quilts from them. We staffed our "Mountain of Quilts" booth at the Quilt Show to spread the word even further about our efforts. We held a "leader/ender" challenge with mixed results. We congratulate Mary Ann Naylor for winning the challenge drawing. We started our own Facebook page and are up to 260 members. We have grown our core committee to 12 very active members. They are such a joy to work with! 2022 was a very good year!

We are going to start out 2023 with a new challenge. We are pleased to announce our "2023 Strip and Block Challenge". See the flyer about the Challenge in the Newsletter, on the Web Site, and on our Charity Central Facebook page. We will have "jelly rolls" available for pick up but we really want to encourage you to use your own fabric and clean out your stash. You can use any width of strip, and length of strip, any color of strip. Start with that bag of scrap binding I know you have and make a "Jelly Roll Race" Quilt. Use the shorter pieces to make blocks. The idea is to use the entire strip and get it out of your stash! We can't wait to see what you come up with!

We will have our quilt kits, our to-be-quilted kits, our one pound bundles, and our new "UFO kits" at the Membership meeting. I have been storing about six bins worth of orphan blocks, UFOs, preprinted blocks and panels, and lots of other fun stuff. I went through all of that and made up kits for you to create something wonderful with. The UFO kits are not complete kits, they are the seeds to challenge you to make something new. They will need your fabric, possibly your orphan blocks, and your imagination!

You have seen the wonderful things I have made from the UFO bins, now it's your turn! Take what there is and add your own spin. Use up more of your fabric and orphans and clean out some more! Your family will thank you for it and so will we! We will be working with the WSQ Quilting Bee this year. Mark your calendars for May 20 when we will have a Charity Central Sewing Day at the Country Homes Christian Church. There will be space for 30 machines and pressing/cutting stations. It will be so much fun; I hope you will be able to join us.
