
We are looking for someone to head the Retreats and Bus Trip committee. Last year's retreat was a big hit. Please contact me if you can help us continue these fun events.

Charity Central

Charity Central has had a busy year! Thanks to all of you, it has been a very good year. We moved all our fabric to a storage unit just over a year ago and have worked hard on turning it all over. We started out the year by giving away 200-300 kits that had been made with all our scrappiest fabric. We then gave away a good bunch of our old fabric to other groups that were doing charity work for others. We separated out all the "odd" things that had been donated to us and used them as "fundraisers". We sold our vintage quilts, cross stitch quilts, kits, and patterns to all of you at our Membership meetings. We sold the last of our vintage quilts to "Just Sew Vintage" at the Quilt Show. We raised \$1800 this year. Thank you!

You have donated 450 quilts to the Spokane Community through such organizations as Cancer Care NW, Catholic Charities, Corbin Center, Hospice of Spokane, Mission Community Outreach, Refugee Connection, Rockwood Cancer Center, Ronald McDonald House, Sacred Heart Chaplins, Salvation Army, Spokane County Fire District 4, Vanessa Behan, Transitions - Families in Protection, and Volunteers of America. We helped the Spokane Valley Quilters with their Camp Goodtimes project by donating 50 quilts to them. If you know of any other organizations we should contact, we would love to hear about them. Our policy is to donate to organizations, rather than individuals, and to keep our donations local in Eastern Washington and Northern Idaho. We will not be donating to disaster relief in other areas, we will leave that to all of you.

We have given away our entire inventory of fabric! The only fabric we currently have stored is our latest donation from Shabby Fabrics. We want to give a huge "Thank You!" to Shabby for all the fabric they have given us over the last several years. They donate about 500 pounds of fabric to us twice a year. We sort it by color and make kits, One Pound Bundles, Charity Rolls, and Charity Cakes. Some we use for Fundraising, some we share with other WSQ committees, and some we give away to other organizations that are doing charity work. Our current plan is to use or give away all our Shabby Fabric donations by the time we get the next donation. We are in the fabric using business, not the fabric storing business! We have a list of about 25 organizations that are looking for fabric, If you or your Small Group would like to be added, send an email to charity.central@wsqspokane.org with your contact info, what kind of fabric you would like, the projects you are working on, and for whom. We get frequent inquiries from others that are looking to downsize their stash. It is wonderful to have a list to send them when I must tell them we are not accepting fabric donations.

We are in the process of making backings to go with all our current quilt tops. Once the backings are made, battings and bindings are cut to go with them. We plan to store our "to be quilted" quilts as bundles ready to give to anyone who would like to practice their quilting skills. We accept hand quilted, machine quilted, and tied quilts of any size. We received approximately 20 rolls of batting from donations this year. That is about what we need to furnish all our donated tops with battings. With our rental of the storage unit after our 2023 budget had been set, we ended up spending most of our money on rent. Thank you for keeping us in business with your batting donations!

Because we are getting all our quilt tops paired up with backs, we are running out of suitable backing fabric. We get a lot of fabric from Shabby but it is mostly WOF strips that are less than half a yard long. These make great scrappy kits but are not so good for making backings. We are currently accepting donations of fabric that is two yards or more in length. I know you have some in your stash that you bought for a specific project and then changed your mind. Or you wonder what was I thinking when I bought so much of that? We would be very happy to take those off your hands!

Our 2024 Budget is printed elsewhere in the Newsletter. If approved by you, we will have enough money for rent and for a few other things. We should be able to purchase some batting and some backing, but it won't be enough to do the 450-500 quilts we usually donate in a year. The way the budget works is that we are allotted that much money for the year, and no matter how much we fundraise or what monetary donations we get, that is all the money we are allowed. If we do well with fundraising this year, we might get more money next year. That is why we request batting and fabric, rather than money, from you. We try to be self-sustaining, meaning that we try to fundraise as much money as we are budgeted.

We currently have about 150 kits ready to be pieced, more than 100 quilts ready to be quilted, and tons of fabric that needs to be cut to be made into kits. We have 420 members on our Charity Central Facebook page. We are always looking for help and are happy to take whatever you feel you can give. If you want to piece, quilt, cut, distribute quilts, or anything else that may come up, we are happy to have help with any of those. If you are looking for something to work on over the winter, we would love pieced 6 ½" blocks! They can be any color, any pattern, anything you want to use up and give away. We will put them with other 6 ½" fabric squares and make kits out of them. You can never have too many "Scrappy Squares" Kits!

Lastly, I would like to thank the Charity Central Committee for all the great work they do all year long! We have monthly Committee meetings where we sort and cut fabric, make kits, sort and bundle quilts, and all the other things we need to do to keep things moving along. We now have a committee of about 15 to do all this work and that is why things are going so well. Thank You!

Margie Karavitis Award

Congratulations to Julie Neuffer who received the Margie Karavitis Award for her lovely quilt, "Primitive Rose". Julie won the Award for a number of reasons:



- 1. Her hand appliqué is beautifully done with small, even, nearly invisible stitches. Curves are smooth, straight lines are straight, and points are well done and free of bulk. All edges are properly turned under and there are no fraying points or edges.
- 2. Her hand quilting consists of small stitches that are of equal length on both front and back. The quilting stitches fill the spaces properly and work well with the overall design of the quilt top. All knots were buried and aren't visible on either front or back.
- 3. Her borders are straight, frame the quilt well, and are proportionate to the quilt.
- 4. Finally, her binding is straight, even, and well-filled.

We hope to see more hand quilted entries in the 2024 show. Please remember that details matter for the Margie Karavitis Award.

For anyone interested in hand appliqué, we have a small group that meets at The Hive from 10 am to I pm on the second Tuesday of the month. There will be no meetings in December and January.

Notes to 2024 Budget

On December 1, 2023, my budget committee consisting of Paula Ferry, Dina Pappas (incoming President), Vicki Trudel, Cathy Anderson (incoming Treasurer), Glenda Carlsson (incoming 1st VP), Patty Yedinak, and Annette Drennen (incoming quilt show chair) met via Zoom to prepare the 2024 WSQ budget.


The process of preparing the budget consists of the committee carefully comparing the current year's budget with the actual income and expenditures and then we review the 2024 budget requests provided by the various committees for both the General and Quilt Show budgets relative to that comparison as well as the needs of the guild. Then the budget is prepared for the presentation to the board for approval.

The 2024 WSQ Budgets were presented to the board on December 6, 2023 and after discussion, both budgets were unanimously passed

Listed below are comments, changes or additions related to the 2024 budget:

- **General Budget** As previously discussed, WSQ has been dealing with covid-related losses leading to a dues increase in 2023. This substantially helped the general budget to be more self-sustaining.
- Retreats & Bus Trips In 2023, Kayla McNett and Arlene Sexton took over retreats & bus trips and their retreat was very successful in 2023. Due to life changes, Kayla is unable to continue with this committee. We currently do not have anyone available to take it on, however the budget committee and board voted to go ahead and fund it in case someone wants to step up and take this over.
- **Membership** We have steadily been able to rebuild our membership even with last year's increase in the dues.
- Mystery Quilt In 2022, Darlene Mossman started a mystery quilt which included a pattern and instructions each quarter. This has been popular and successful in 2023. She is continuing with a new pattern and mystery quilt for 2024 so the committee was funded for this with some exciting extras planned.
- Newsletter Ad Income We have an actual maximum income amount as per the IRS limit of \$1,000. Unfortunately, in the past few years, fewer and fewer people have paid to advertise in our newsletter. The cost is very inexpensive, and if you are interested, you can contact our current Newsletter Chair, Ruth McCormick, to place an ad for your business in the Newsletter.
- **Newsletter Printing Income**: We separated out the additional amount paid with membership dues for those individuals who wanted to pay for a printed newsletter. This line item represents about 30 people wanting a printed and mailed newsletter.
- Quilting Bee This is one of the sponsored events where the venue cost almost doubled for 2023. It is also one of those sponsored events that has had waning interest. In 2023, the committee and board funded this for 2 meetings instead of the usual 4 with the hope that there would be an increase in attendance and if there wasn't the committee determined that it would no longer be funded due to the expense. However, the board decided to fund it for another year for two meetings for 2024, with the hope that we could renew the enthusiasm of our Bees by offering speakers, door prizes and all the fun we had pre-pandemic.

- Yard Sale The Yard Sale continues to be one of those events that are very popular to our members. However, the venues are harder to find and are increasingly expensive. Kelly is working on this for 2024 and it was funded accordingly.
- **Miscellaneous** there were many committees that have had a budgeted line item, but over the years were never used so those were eliminated. Sadly, one of those for 2024 is the Library. The remaining library books and magazines will be sold in 2024.
- Other We always include a budgeted line item in both the General and Quilt Show budgets which is 'Other'. This is the amount of expected profit we need from the Quilt Show to fund the shortfall in the General Budget.
- Quilt Show Our committee again addressed the increase of costs across the board. We had to increase the budget amounts for the fairgrounds, LCD and other categories. The Quilt Show is WSQ's primary fundraising event which supports the general budget, and also it is our primary fundraising event that supports our mission statement. For 2023 we had approximately 500 fewer attendees and if we had not increased our entry fee, we would have not broken even for this event. Additionally, we have aging equipment and quilt show supplies that need to be replaced or repaired. We had to pay for two tablets and easels among other things with no budget in the capital account to cover this.
- **Boutique** The Boutique is a favorite among our show attendees and more of our talented members and non-members are consigning to sell at the show. As a result, we are discussing moving their location to a larger and less crowded space in the show.
- In Memoriam Last year the grain silo was used to house this new exhibition which was set up to honor our WSQ members who had passed away in 2022. This was a very popular exhibition and as a result, the committee decided to make this a continuing addition to our show.
- **Professional Fees** For 2022 and 2023 we had to engage an attorney to help us with the Fairgrounds contract. We are hoping that the Fairgrounds will change it for 2024 as suggested by our attorney, however it was decided by the committee that we should provide funding in case of other contractual or other needs that would require the services of an attorney.
- Capital Account The Capital Account is a savings account funded by excess profits from the Quilt Show, not used to balance the General Budget. This account was set up to cover one-of-a kind expenses for both budgets. At the beginning of 2023 we had \$148 left in this account and knew that we needed to upgrade our credit card payment equipment. Other expenditures were for bins and easels. In 2024 we will need sheets to be replaced as well as more easels, bins, new shelving for stash check and a more permanent credit card payment solution.
- LTAC GRANT In October various members were approached and suggested that WSQ apply
 for a grant that the City of Spokane Valley offers each year. This had been on our current
 Treasurer, Vicki Trudel's radar for many years, and after researching this and talking with both the
 existing executive and incoming board, we decided to apply to see if we qualified and could get it.
- What is the LTAC Grant: The LTAC Grant is also known as the Lodging Tax Advisory Committee. This grant is funded by the City of Spokane Valley and awarded to various non-profits or other organizations to put 'heads in beds' as they say. This is a grant to promote tourism for the City of Spokane Valley to utilize the hotels and motels.

Because the WSQ quilt show brings in people from out of town and out of state, we were encouraged to apply for the grant.

After submitting a complex application as well as projected operating and business budgets, Vicki Trudel and I presented in front of the committee along with all the other applicants. Paula Ferry was present as well to offer support and for any questions. This was on October 26, 2023.

On December 12, 2023 the City of Spokane Valley's City Council met to vote on all grants that were in the review process from November 14th. All were approved.

WSQ applied for \$25,000 and the final award amount is \$17,500. The contracts have not been prepared or signed and most likely will not be until the end of the year.

As you can imagine this presented a unique and challenging budget process because at the time the board met to go over and vote on the 2024 budget, the review process was still going on and the final amount was not determined. As a result, the budget committee had to prepare the normal Quilt Show budget and vote to approve that along with the General Budget for 2024. We also had to present and approve a conditional budget for this grant. This was presented and unanimously approved.

- This grant is a tourism grant and when we applied for and presented to the LTAC committee, we were required to state how the grant would bring in out of town attendees to our show.
- It is a 'reimbursable' grant which means that we have to spend the money and submit the invoices for reimbursement.
- The grant award funds can <u>only</u> be spent on the items we presented to the committee, and a revised budget will be sent in with the contracts.
- The goal is to make the Washington State Quilt Show a 'Destination Quilt Show'.
- For many years our show attendance has remained at between 3,000 and as high as 4,000 attendees with an average of around 3,400 attendees each year. With increasing costs for the venue and LCD as well as aging payment systems, and supplies needed for the show, we have been showing less profits from the show. With this grant, we can expand the show to make it more enticing for new people from out of state to attend by offering more events and vendors.
- We have many plans in discussion to achieve the goal of expanding our show and fulfilling the requirements for this grant. Annette Drennen will be updating our members with information during the quarterly meetings.

I would like to thank my committee for the help and insight they provide in the preparation of this budget as well as our board for the hard work they do throughout the year to support the guild.







DOUBLE SQUARE

USE JEWEL TONE PRINTS WITH PASTEL PRINTS (FOR LIGHT AND DARK) UTILIZING WINTER







FOR A. CUT 2 BLOCKS 6 7/8" OUT OF YOUR JEWEL TONE FABRIC.

FOR B. CUT 2 BLOCKS 6 7/8" OUT OF YOUR PASTEL FABRIC.


Put the jewel tone and pastel block right sides together. Next a draw a line diagonally from corner to corner. Sew a scant ¼" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Cut on the center line making two triangles. Open triangles and press to dark sides. Using the above diagram, set blocks into your squares, using a scant ¼" seam allowance. You may try this: Use two different pastels for A. Unfinished block should measure 12 ½". Okay quilters, have fun and into your stash for this one. It is quick and fun to make.
